CURRY CONNECTION

What Is Your Name Again?

Learning people's names has been very important to me. Although my memory is very limited, I still strive to call and learn everyone by their correct name. Have you ever accidentally called someone by the incorrect name? Of course, you have! This is something we all have done, and when you realize it, I always feel so embarrassed and troubled. Why is that? It is not just the fact that you were incorrect, but you do not want your mistake to hurt the one who heard your error.

As Christians, we should feel the same way about God's word. We should also desire to speak correctly. In fact, the Scripture encourages it. "If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God..." (1 Peter 4:11 NKJV). In this passage, the word oracles, "λόγιον" in its original Greek, can also be translated as "an utterance (of God):-oracle." So Peter is encouraging us Christians that when we speak, let us speak as God speaks. This would mean we should avoid speaking or saying things God did not say or using our vocabulary in a way God did not. This incorrect way of speaking spreads disunity, strife, and confusion.

There are incorrect ways to use Scripture. "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15). Paul instructs Timothy to rightly divide the word, and in doing so, he will be presenting himself approved to God. This also reveals that we can incorrectly divide the word. So, it is very possible to misinterpret the Scripture and then teach it. This has caused a great amount of error to be spread across the world. So to avoid this ourselves, let us mirror Jesus, "...Therefore, whatever I speak, just as the Father has told Me, so I speak" (John 12:50). Jesus spoke just as Peter mentioned in 1 Peter 4:11, as the oracle of God. Jesus, as we should also do, did not usurp His authority over the Father by speaking incorrectly.

Just as we hope not to hurt someone with our mistaken use of vocabulary when we call someone by the wrong name, we can really harm someone's soul by speaking or teaching errors. This is to be a huge concern for everyone! Teachers are cautioned in Scripture to guard their tongues (James 3). So when it comes to how we speak, let us, as those before us during the Restoration Movement encouraged, "Where the Bible Speaks, We Speak; Where the Bible Is Silent. We Are Silent" and "Let us Do Bible Things in Bible Ways and Call Bible Things by Bible Names." These slogans are not Scripture, but as the Scripture has encouraged, these slogans express a Scriptural idea and avoid the corrupt use of vocabulary. Let us not hurt someone with our words by speaking not as oracles of God.

Let's take a minute to consider our need for Jesus in our life. In a world filled with uncertainty and trials, one truth remains constant: our need for Jesus. John 15:5 declares, "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5 NKJV).

No matter our accomplishments or strengths, we are utterly dependent on Christ for life and purpose. Without Him, we are like branches severed from the vine, withering away in spiritual emptiness. Recognizing our need for Jesus is the first step toward true transformation and fulfillment. Philippians 4:13 affirms, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13). Let's embrace our dependency on Jesus, surrendering our lives to Him completely. In His presence, we find hope, strength, and purpose beyond measure.

DOUG'S DISCUSSION

They Are Your Life

There have been many fairy tales told of an object granting or sustaining life. Can you imagine how carefully something like that would be guarded if someone actually had such a thing? I can picture the magic flower being checked twenty times a day just to make sure it's safe. Or the one-of-a-kind stone always being kept in your pocket to make sure it will never be misplaced. That is the kind of care that makes sense for something that your very life is connected to. You're not going to neglect something if losing it means you die.

We don't live in a fairy tale, so I won't ask you where your magic life-giving rock is. But ... I will ask you where your Bible is. Do you have one by your bed? Has it frequented the table by your favorite chair? Has it been on your phone? (Has it been on there as much as your social media?) We talk at church so much about the importance of reading the Word. I assure you that this isn't to give busy work. It's not to read something that is kind of interesting, but that's all. No, I ask you where your Bible is because of the power contained in those pages. As Moses once said: "Take to heart all the words I have solemnly declared to you this day, so that you may command your children to obey carefully all the words of this law. They are not just idle words for you – they are your life..." (Deuteronomy 32:46-47).

These words were their life. Knowing that they carried them around at all times. They recited them at festivals. When the Israelites were wise, they used the words of life as a guide for faith and practice. If they followed them, they would "live long in the land" (32:47). At other times, they would fail to cherish the Word, even going to the point of burning passages they didn't like (see Jeremiah 36:23). Times like that were not blessed, they did not lead to life.

The Word that was life for the Israelites is still life for us. Do you really know what it is? The Bible is not just some book. It is not even just a good book. It is THE Good Book. The words in other books can inspire, but the words in the Word are your life! If we lived in a fairy tale story someone holding a Bible would guard it, treasure it, and keep coming back to it five, ten, even twenty times a day to be rejuvenated by its power. That life sustaining Holy Book would be at the middle of the plot for sure, and at the middle of the main character's life. This is not a fairy tale. In reality, the Word which gives life is often treated as mere idle words. And that, I fear, makes a big difference to the chance of happily ever after.


