

DANA'S DIRECTION

"I was a stranger (student) and you took me in"

Going away to college is an extremely important transition in the life of a young person. For many kids raised in Christian homes, it is the first time they will be challenged to be a faithful member of the church without being compelled by their parents. That first Sunday morning in the dorm, nobody will rap on their door and say "get up and get dressed. It's time for church."

Unfortunately, this is also a time when many young people fall away from the Lord. When we were living in Knoxville, the churches of Christ had an active Student Center on the campus of the University of Tennessee. They learned that even in a state where the church is very strong, only twenty-some percent of the incoming freshmen who listed membership in the church affiliated with a local congregation while in school.

You would assume that the problem would be alleviated by sending your children to a Christian college. It is true that the atmosphere is much more conducive to Christian living, but there are many students who "fall through the cracks." They just never develop a relationship with a home congregation. Consequently, they grow weaker in both their faith and commitment.

While the college can do a good job in addressing the spiritual needs of students, the local congregations also play a key role in keeping them faithful to the church. I remember as a young man from a small home congregation, I felt lost in the crowd on the campus of a Christian college. The "College" church was a little better because I was just one of more than a thousand students who were attending. Although my commitment had always been strong, I soon learned that I could miss church and nobody seemed to know or to care.

This all changed when I began attending a congregation that put forth an active effort to reach out to students. I was "adopted" by a family in the congregation. Occasionally, we had devotionals in the members' houses, or were invited to dinner after Sunday services. I placed membership with the congregation and was active as a song leader, bible class teacher, and the evangelistic efforts of the local congregation. It strengthened my faith and helped me make the transition from a teen to an adult.

We have a real opportunity in Parkersburg to reach out to the young people who are arriving to attend OVU. Our connections to Ohio Valley go back to its very beginnings. Over the past few years, we have not had as many students attending as once did. We would like your help in changing that. Yesterday, a group of volunteers helped students move into their dorms. We have passed out flyers and plan to provide transportation for those wanting to attend our services. All of this will be helpful, **but they key to our success in this efforts is YOU.**

We all need to have a good and loving attitude toward these young people. Remember what it was like when you were away from home for the first time! Make sure to talk to all of our visitors. Open up the door of your heart and of your home. We would love to develop a significant college-age group at Camden Avenue. If we reach out to them, they will come.

Remember the words that Jesus indicated would be said in the Day of Judgment. "I was a stranger, and you took me in." When it was asked "when did we see you (in that condition), Jesus responded, "inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to Me." (Matthew 25:34-40)
