# IT'S SO PERSONAL

God loves the world. That's true. But it doesn't have quite the same impact as saying, "God loves *me*."

For most of us the supremely important things of life are the personal things, the things that touch *us*. To read of people being shot and killed in the subway concerns us, but if one of the victims turns out to be a family member, "concern" hardly conveys our feelings. Only when it gets personal does it become real.

Rock of Ages cleft for the world! That's as true as could be, but it's not quite the same as saying, "Rock of Ages cleft for *me*." The power comes when it gets personal.

Listen to the testimony of the apostle Paul: "The life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved *me* and gave himself for *me*" (Galatians 2:20). Now that is the real thing!

Christianity as a system of doctrine is beautiful, but it becomes saving and powerful only when it is personal. It's when I can say, "I believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God...I was buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, I too might walk in newness of life...I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives me," that Christianity becomes a real force and power.

Is your life dissatisfying? Does God seem unreal and far away? Maybe it's because you have acquiesced in thought to a form of doctrine, an acquiescence which costs you nothing. You know the truth and the words, but you have missed the power. It's never become personal...nor has it become satisfying.

A new day will dawn when I can say, "My Lord, and my God."

You are encouraged to read ahead to help be ready for Bible class. Here is where we will be, and when.


Sunday, Dec 1st: Conduct expected in the new land (Deut 16-22).
