DANA'S DIRECTION THE CHRISTIAN'S GROWTH FORMULA

Most of us realize that growth is a gradual, daily process. Through daily exercise, the weak can become strong. Even recovery from illness is usually marked by noticeable, daily improvement. What we often fail to realize is that our Christian life should also be one of daily strengthening, healing and growth. Paul said, "Though our outward man is perishing, our inward man is renewed day by day." (II Cor. 5:16)

Spiritual growth does not come about without effort. Nor does one become mature overnight. But there are spiritual exercises that will strengthen us and draw us closer to Christ. If we "meditate on these things and give ourselves entirely to them...our progress will become evident to all." (I Tim. 4:15) Make the following practices a part of your life, and you'll be amazed at how much you will grow.

TALK TO GOD EVERY DAY. Paul said, "continue steadfastly in prayer" (Rom. 12:12). We must not think of prayer as something that detracts from our efforts—rather as something which strengthens them. A harried businessman said, "I have so much to do today I can't possibly accomplish what I must without spending at least an hour in prayer." When we "pray without ceasing," we are never alone. Our life becomes a joint-venture with God. "In everything by prayer and supplication, let your requests be made known unto God." (Phil. 4:16)

LET GOD TALK TO YOU EVERY DAY, God, through His Spirit, has given us a written guide for life. The Word of God is profitable for teaching, correction and instruction in righteous living (II Tim. 3:16). Meditating on it will make us wiser than our enemies (Psalm 119:97), and show us the way of salvation. How we frustrate the Spirit when we fail to take seriously God's word.

TELL SOMEONE ELSE ABOUT JESUS EVERY DAY. We sometimes feel alienated from the rest of the world because of Christianity. That's unnecessary because it isn't true. The people you know and work with have the same questions and are confronted by the same trials as you. What you have found to benefit you will benefit them as well. Talking about Jesus should be as natural as talking about any other loved one or friend.

<u>DO A GOOD DEED FOR JESUS EVERY DAY.</u> Nothing gives one a greater sense of purpose and self-worth than helping others. As Jesus said, "it is more blessed to give than it is to receive" (Acts 20:35). The good that we do for others will bless us, benefit us, benefit the ones we help, and bring glory to God. (II Cor. 9:11-14).

ENCOURAGE A FELLOW CHRISTIAN EVERY DAY. We should realize that if we sometimes struggle in our efforts to live for Jesus, our brothers and sisters do as well. A word of kindness, support, or encouragement can mean so much. A card or a phone call, at the right time, can change someone's mood, make their day, even change the course of their life. "Let us exhort one another daily" (Heb. 3:13)

Try doing each of these every day and you'll be amazed at the growth you will experience in your Christian life.

"MARY HAD A LITTLE BOY . . . "

Bible study is very important. We must know what the Bible teaches in order to obey God. We need to be very careful that we do not simply rely on someone else's knowledge for our own understanding. We need to know what the Bible teaches because one day we will be judged individually by it (John 12:48). Because of this fact, we, as a congregation of God's people, assemble together on Sunday mornings at 9:30 and on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 for Bible study.

However, there are members of the church, even some with children, who evidently do not see the need to study God's Word together. We must realize what we are saying to others by our example in not coming to Bible Study. To our brothers and sisters in Christ we are saying, "Fellowship with you is not important to me." To the babe in Christ we are saying, "You don't really have to study the Bible to grow." To the visitor we are saying, "There is not much interest in studying the Bible here." To the Bible class teacher we are saying, "Your preparation for class means nothing to me." To God we are saying, "I don't love You and Your Word enough to take two extra hours of my time each week to go to Bible Study."

Sometime ago, I came across the following poem entitled, "Mary Had A Little Boy." The author is unknown to me, but the poem teaches a powerful lesson. Please read it carefully and honestly and ask yourself "Have I been attending Bible study and worship as a true child of God should?" If you have not, make a change TODAY!

He never went to Bible school 'cause Mary wouldn't go.

He never heard the stories of Christ to thrill his little mind.

While other children went to class, this child was left behind.

And as he grew from babe to youth, she saw to her dismay,
