DANA'S DIRECTION "HOW MUCH DO WE LOVE THE LOST"

Many excuses are made as to why the church is not growing; we say we are too busy or that others are not interested. But, I believe, the main reason the church is not growing as it should or even as it once did is because we simply do not love the lost as much as we should. How much should we love the lost?

- 1. **WE SHOULD LOVE THE LOST AS ALL HEAVEN DOES.** God loves the world. (John 3:16) Jesus died for sinners. (Romans 5:8) The Holy Spirit has given us the gospel which is the power of God to save the lost. Both He and the Bride invite those who are lost to come. (Rev. 22:17) The angels rejoice over one sinner who repents. Who loves the lost? All heaven does!
- 2. **WE SHOULD LOVE THE LOST AS THE EARLY CHURCH DID.** Just 30 years after Christ commanded the gospel to be taken into all the world, Paul said that it had been done! (Colossians 1:23) How did it happen? Not by the apostles alone. Not by the evangelists and elders alone. It took every member, going everywhere, preaching the word. (Acts 8:4)
- 3. WE SHOULD LOVE THE LOST WITH SYMPATHY AND COMPASSION. Jesus wept over the city of Jerusalem because it represented thousands of lost souls. Every day we come into contact with hundreds of people, but until we stop thinking of them only as neighbors and friends and begin to think of them as lost souls in need of salvation, we will never win them to Christ. How many tears are being shed, how many prayers are being offered out of concern for the lost?
- 4. **OUR LOVE FOR THE LOST MUST BE PERSONAL.** "Go ye" means "Go me!" There may not be much that you can do to win the lost but there is something. Every one of us can give a lesson tract to a friend or invite a neighbor to come with us to church.
- 5. **OUR LOVE FOR THE LOST MUST BE SACRIFICIAL.** Paul said he would give his soul for the salvation of his people if that were possible. What would we give? Is it worth an evening of our time? Perhaps some of the money we normally use for recreation or to purchase things we don't really need? Are we willing to risk not being in a particular social circle? Jesus sacrificed everything to purchase our salvation. What is the value of a soul?
- 6. **WE MUST LOVE THE LOST URGENTLY**. Time is running out. The same person you could have taught today may be listed in tomorrow's obituary. David once wrote "no man cares for my soul." (Psalm 142:4) How tragic it will be to see those in judgment who we could have taught only to have them say "You never mentioned Him to me."
