Take Heed

"Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall"
[I Corinthians 10:12]

Early in the second quarter of the football game between the Buffalo Bills and the New York Jets, the Bills were pinned deep in their own territory. They were facing third down. Quarterback Kyle Orton dropped back and threw a strike to a streaking Sammy Watkins. The rookie wide receiver was off to the races and all set to score what would be an 89-yard touchdown (which would have been the longest in the NFL this year).

But Watkins did not score on the play.

Long before he crossed the goal line, he slowed down. He began celebrating. He raised his right arm in triumph. It was then that New York's Saalim Hakim tackled Watkins at about the five-yard line. He got caught from behind. He was completely unaware that the other player was closing in on him. We can understand how he felt. He thought he had it made and he was anxious to celebrate.

In my estimation, his failure to score was connected to at least three things: 1. He gave up too soon. 2. He was not aware of his surroundings. 3. His opponent refused to give up.

Consider some spiritual applications based on this illustration:

- Too often, Christians give up too soon in the Christian race. "And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up" [Galatians 6:9]. "Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted" [Hebrews 12:3].
- 2. We must be aware of our surroundings. There may be people, habits, situations, etc. that we are associated with and have become involved in that are stunting our growth and hindering our ability to run the race. "Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you? unless indeed you fail to meet the test!" [2 Corinthians 13:5]. "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us" [Hebrews 12:1].
- 3. Our opponent, Satan, is also one who refuses to give up. "And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time" [Luke 4:13]. "Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour" [I Peter 5:8].

Don't give up! Keep running! Heaven will be worth it!

If someone is attacking one of their family members (brothers or sisters in Christ) they quickly come to their defense. They endeavor to "do unto others" as we find taught in Matthew 7:12.

I BELIEVE in YOUNG PEOPLE because they are so enthusiastic, so full of life and energetic. They truly can "move mountains" when their power and potential is harnessed. In the Lord's work, they have the potential of doing great things, if properly guided in that way.

I BELIEVE in YOUNG PEOPLE because of the love they show one for the other. They are not afraid to say "I care about you" or "I love you." They are willing to share a gentle touch or hug in greeting one another or in parting company. Such action is similar to the kiss (Romans 16:16) of the first century. We should not so act "for show" but when sincerely conveyed to a member of the family it is good. The church is to be a close-knit body. We are to be known by the world for our love for one another. Young people show their love for one another.

I BELIEVE in YOUNG PEOPLE because they are teachable. They, like Apollos (Acts 18:24), are willing to be shown the way of the Lord. They will listen to opinions and thoughts of others, and when it is right, will change. They desire to go to heaven and by the grace of God, they are determined to make it their final home.

Let us follow such characteristics of the young people.
