## A Time to Grow:

In Ecclesiastes 3:1, Solomon writes "To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven." I thought of this verse as we are all getting a bit of "cabin-fever," being stuck inside through all of the snow and extreme cold we have been experiencing over the past couple of weeks! But, what better time could there be, what better purpose could we make of our time indoors than to grow in the knowledge of God's word?

We are already involved in a study of Solomon's writings (Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and the Song of Solomon) in our Bible classes. I thought it also might be beneficial to focus my sermons on Sunday morning and evening on special studies from the word of God.

Beginning next Sunday morning, we will be studying the topic "Why I believe." My purpose for presenting these lessons will be to strengthen our faith and better equip us to teach others. The lesson topics will be as follows:

"Why I believe in God"

"Why I believe the Bible is the word of God"

"Why I believe that Jesus Christ is the son of God"

"Why I believe in the church we read about in the Bible"

"Why I believe in baptism"

"Why I believe in the Lord's Supper"

"Why I believe in the resurrection of Jesus"

In addition to this series of lessons on Sunday mornings, I also plan to use our Sunday evening lessons as study of the last week of Jesus' life on earth as drawn from a harmony of the four gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. I believe doing so will give us a better understanding and appreciation for all that Jesus taught on his way to the cross, and all that he suffered to bring salvation to man.
