OUR ANCHOR OF HOPE

A man can endure almost anything as long as there is hope. As long as there is hope he can put up with privation; he can stand severe hardship; he can accept harsh confinement; he can live with discomfort; he can be patient through long illness; and he can face death with courage and confidence. To Christians hope is the anchor or stabilizer of the soul (Hebrews 6:19). It is no wonder, then, that the devil will do everything within his power to undermine our hope.

When Christians speak of hope, we are not speaking of a mere wish, but of an earnest desire coupled with great expectation. Our hope is not characterized by doubt, but a confident expectation of good, and especially the confident and joyful expectation of eternal life. Our hope is steadfast and sure. It is our hope which brings optimism to a dark and dismal world. It is hope which enables us to cope with the disappointments and despair that often comes in life. It is hope which makes it possible for us to face death with serenity.

The Christian's hope is the hope of the resurrection of the dead (I Thessalonians 4:13-18); it is the hope of glory with God (Romans 5:2); it is the hope of salvation in Jesus Christ (Titus 1:3; 3:7); it is the hope of His second coming; and it is the hope of heaven for the redeemed (Colossians 1:5). Because of our hope, no matter what happens, no matter what burdens we must bear, no matter what disappointments we must face, no matter what trials we encounter, as God's people, we will overcome.

The language of the New Testament is the language of confident hope. Paul wrote that we are "more than conquerors through him that loved us" (Romans 8:37). He praised God for the assurance that we always triumph in Christ (II Corinthians 2:14). He promised that all things "work together for good" for the redeemed (Romans 8:28). And, he asserted that all things are possible in Jesus Christ (Philippians 4:13). John confirmed this hope when he wrote: "greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world" (I John 4:4). No matter what, victory belongs to the people of God (I John 5:1-5). With that hope, each day is filled with meaning and promise.

Hopelessness does not exist for God's people. When life comes crashing down around us, when friends fail, when it looks like our enemies are about to triumph, we look to Jesus and the hope which anchors the soul. And, we know that it is well with us.

A Holy Nation

In at least four different Old Testament passages, the expression, "The Beauty of Holiness" is penned. Holiness is indeed beautiful. It is as good as repentance, as important as confession and as valued as forgiveness. You see, something that is holy is sacred, dedicated to God and set apart for His use. Peter says that we are a "chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people" (I Pet 2.9); yet we live in a time when the value and beauty of holiness is not ecognized, and is not seen for what it is.

In fact, rather than focusing upon the "Beauty of Holiness," we live in a time when people have flip-flopped this biblical expression and are being deceived by what they think is the "Holiness of Beauty."

Take a moment to look around. Note of how the church sometimes seems more preoccupied with "beauty," rather than "holiness." Want an example? Congregational singing is giving way in some churches to special group singing and choruses. Forget about the "beauty of holiness" in the cracking, failing voice of an aged Christian widow singing, "Heaven Will Surely Be Worth It All," and make room for the perceived "holiness of beauty" in the melodic, trained voices of nearly professional singers. Why do you suppose that mechanical instrumental music is heard in churches today that once belonged to the Lord? Someone along the way decided that anything that sounded that "beautiful" must be "holy." God decides what is beautiful, what is holy in His kingdom, not man.

Friends, don't misunderstand. There is nothing wrong in beauty; it's just not our aim. Our effort should be toward holiness realizing that our value to God is not in beauty, but in service to His kingdom. Remember, we are to worship God in the "beauty of holiness," not in the "holiness of beauty."

"Give unto the LORD the glory due to His name; Worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness" (Psalm 29.2).
