Reaching Out to OVU Students

When I attended Harding University more than 80% of the students were members of the Church of Christ. I was surprised, however to see that on any given Sunday morning, there were many students still in the dorm, not attending church. In my conversations I found that they often were having problems adapting to being away from home and missed the familiarity of their home congregation.

Today, on the campus of most Christian colleges, there are as many students who are not members of the church as there are those who are. We recognize the importance of campus ministries reaching out to state universities, but fail, at times to see the benefit of working with students at the Christian school in our own community. This year we would like to commit ourselves to support the students of Ohio Valley University.

We want to continue the things that we have done successfully, and add some additional efforts as well. Here is a list of possibilities:

- Monthly Wednesday Night Dinners for college-age
- College-age class, Sunday morning and Wednesday night
- Adopt-a-Student Program
- Transportation (van or bus) on campus for every service

Soon, we will have a couple of opportunities to meet incoming students:

Move-in day, August 24th. We would like to take as many as would like to help incoming students get settled into their dorms. We can offer a friendly smile and a helping hand. It would be nice to do this as families. Junior High and High School students will get a first hand look at college life. Maybe Mom can bring some cookies. We will provide information about Camden Avenue and make sure they are aware of transportation available.

Student Expo, August 26th. This is a meet-and-greet where new students are informed of available activities, clubs, etc. In addition local businesses and congregations of the Churches of Christ meet the students. We will have a table promoting Camden Avenue. We will need members to man two tables and meet the students. We will also be taking some homemade cookies, so we will need your help there.

We will be having a meeting next Sunday after evening services to discuss and organize these efforts. Some of us have developed friendships with students that have continued on years after they have graduated. We invite all who wish to be involved.

George Bush Shaved His head?

89-year-old former President George H.W. Bush saw members of his secret service detail suddenly walking around baldheaded. Upon investigating, Mr. Bush learned that one of the agent's son, Patrick, was being treated for leukemia.

The 2-year-old has lost his hair, as is often the case with those undergoing cancer treatment. Bush was motivated by more than a feeling of solidarity. It was sympathy. He and Barbara lost their second child, Robin, at 4-years-old nearly 60 years ago (via AP story, Denver Post, 18A, 7/25/13).

What a beautiful gesture! President Bush is extraordinarily healthy for a man just over a decade from 100, he often off parachuting from planes to celebrate birthdays. He did what he did not because he was suffering, but because those for whom he cares are hurting. Most of us admire such commiseration.

The Bible depicts the Perfect Man, Jesus, as supreme in sympathy. The writer of Hebrews says, "For we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who has been tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin" (Heb. 4:15). He was made like us so He could be a merciful and faithful high priest (Heb. 2:17). He came in the likeness of men (Ph. 2:7) to feel what we feel and through the experience be "able to come to the aid of those who are tempted" (cf. Heb. 2:18). He took on flesh, underwent the trials and experiences of humanity, and died all for our benefit.

This takes on greater significance when we emphasize that He did so without sin, that He was raised from the dead. "Therefore, since the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, and might free those who through fear of death were subject to slavery all their lives" (Heb. 2:14-15).

A television show recently aired titled, "Honey, We're Killing the Kids!" It was a story about a family of four which included two young boys that were very unhealthy due to obesity and asthma. They were allowed to eat too much of the wrong kinds of food, and they were allowed to play video games all day. Also the parents smoked around the children in spite of the fact that they had severe asthma. Mom and Dad were given three instructions: get rid of the junk food; turn the electronics off; and stop smoking around the children!

There is a sense today in which many parents are also killing their children spiritually. Keeping the kids protected is important, but it pales in comparison to the responsibility of bringing them up in the nurture and admonition of the

Lord (Ephesians 6:4). As parents we do need to be responsible for our children's attitudes, for what they say, and for their actions.

Our task is not easy, but it is a blessing. But don't let our actions cut the life span of our children either physically or spiritually!
