## Be Kind

There are a lot of things that we can't do. We may look around us and see a variety of skills and abilities that we simply don't have. But one trait that we all possess is the ability to be kind. We can change relationships and influence countless people if we simply have the rule in our way of life to be kind. Paul said in Ephesians 4:32 simply to be kind to one another. This means be kind to your spouse, children, boss, friend, whomever you meet.

In Romans 12:10, Paul stresses that part of the right relationship is "Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another." Whatever feelings we have about another person, let us never underestimate the good that kindness will do.

When we are kind, we are imitating Jesus. He was kind to multitudes who were hungry. His disciples wanted to send them away, but Jesus felt kindly towards them (Mark 6:30-44). Even the woman caught in the act of adultery was dealt with in a kind way by Jesus (John 8:1-11). Even to Peter, whose actions had to be frustrating to Jesus, he was still kind.

I see firmness, but a kind manner, in Paul's dealing with Onesimus as he encouraged him to go back to Philemon after his conversion. It just seems as we look at the really great characters of the Bible, we are continually struck by the impact of kindness.

As we arise each day, let's make it a goal to be kind to the people that we meet that day. We can't help but bring glory to the name of Jesus when we do.

### WHAT ARE YOU BRINGING TO JESUS?

In a popular hymn are these words, "And I have brought to thee, Down from My home above, Salvation full and free, My pardon and My love; I bring, I bring rich gifts to thee, What hast thou brought to Me?" No question about it, Jesus has brought much to us, yea even His very life. In turn, what are we bringing to Jesus?

**Are we bringing souls to Jesus?** Andrew did. "One of the two which heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ. **And he brought him to Jesus . . . "** (John 1:40-42). Jesus came to "seek and save the lost" (Luke 19: 10). Is it not our duty to reach out to the lost with the saving message of Jesus, so that their souls might be saved in the day of Judgment? Ask yourself the questions, "When is the last time that the waters in the baptistry were stirred because of MY willingness to serve God?" "When is the last time that the front pew was warmed by a penitent Christian because I helped someone find Christ?" Are we bringing souls to Jesus?

Are we bringing our children to Jesus? The mothers of Perea did. "Then were there brought unto him little children, that he should put his hands on them, and pray: and the disciples rebuked them. But Jesus said, Suffer little children, and forbid them not, to come unto me: for of such is the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 19:13-14; cf Mark 10: 13-15). These mothers took their children before Jesus so that He might lay hands on them and pray for them. Do we take our children before Jesus so that He will bless them with His "living words?" How often do you bring your children to Bible class and worship? Do you ever allow them to miss the assembling of the saints for such things as homework, school events, or for being too tired to come? Do you pray with your children, open Gods word and read together? Are you bringing your children to Jesus?

Are we bringing our monetary gifts to Jesus? Herod's wise men did. "And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh" (Matt. 2:11). These men knew that Jesus was one deserving of all that they had to give. Will we realize the same and give all that we have to the Lord? When we budget every month what monies will go where, what is the first thing we consider? House? Car? Food? Clothes? Entertainment? Why not put the Lord at the top of our list of priorities, and give Him the very best that we can. After all, what we have is not our own, but it already belongs to the Lord. We are merely stewards of those blessings, and in turn we should give back as we are prosper. Are you bringing your monetary gifts to Jesus?

Jesus continues to bring so much to us. What will we bring to him? Will we bring souls to Him, our children to Him, our monetary gifts to Him? What are you bringing to Jesus?
