DANA'S DIRECTION Footprints of Jesus

Through the years I have had an ongoing frustration with materials purchased for Vacation Bible School programs. In order to market VBS and make the Bible "interesting" to children, I have "prospected for gold" in the Yukon, "gone on safaris" by traveling down the Amazon, and "run with the dogs," in the Alaskan Iditarod. Believe me, it is sometimes quite a stretch to bring Biblical lessons and applications from such fare.

Not only difficult, but quite unnecessary! Why do we think that the stories of the Bible need help to make them interesting? A few months back, the five-week series on the Bible on the History Channel (with all of its shortcomings) was the most widely watched program in years! If taught well, the Bible is interesting, fascinating and always relevant. Kids know it too. A few years ago a little boy told me after a week of learning about Him, said to me "Jesus was kind of a super-hero wasn't He?" I agreed.

This year, we did not want to interrupt our study through the Bible, so we took the chapters that we will study this coming week and divided them into four lessons (five if you include Sunday morning Bible study). In these lessons we learn of how Jesus dealt with rejection and loss of a friend (Matthew 13:53-58; 14:1-12); The miracles that Jesus performed (Matthew 14:13-33); The teachings of Jesus regarding our faith and our hearts (Matthew 15:1-28); The Good Confession and the cost of discipleship (Matthew 16:13-27); The coming of the kingdom and our place in it (Matthew 16:28-17:27)

We have called our VBS study **Footprints of Jesus**. It is our contention that the more we learn about Jesus, and the more we learn from Jesus, the more we will want to become like Jesus. This will all happen if we seek to walk in His steps. Peter wrote to us "for to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should **"follow in His steps"** (I Peter 2:21).

Are we willing to commit ourselves to that? Until we do, we cannot call ourselves disciples. Until we do, we will never know the joy nor the power of living the Christian life! As the familiar hymn says:

Sweetly Lord, have we heard Thee calling, "Come follow me!" And we see where Thy footprints falling lead us to Thee. Footprints of Jesus that make the pathway glow; we will follow the steps of Jesus, where-e'er they go.

CHRISTIANS AND PERSEVERANCE

I recently told about following quote written on the walls of a large university: "On the plains of hesitation lie the blackened bones of countless millions, who, at the dawn of victory, sat down to rest, and resting, died."

Sad, but true, this can describe the lives of many Christians who no longer persevere. You see, my Christian friends, we are at the "dawn of victory." We are not talking about just any victory, but the ultimate victory found on the other side of the "gates of pearl." John described it this way, "And I... saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband' (Rev. 21:2). Paul was at the "dawn of victory," and said, "Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness..." (2 Tim. 4:8). Yet, that victory is only for those who will faithfully persevere. Paul said, "press toward the mark..." (Phil. 3:14); "Fight the good fight of faith..." (I Tim. 6:12); and "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith" (2 Tim. 4:7).

When the Lord comes in judgment, there will be many precious souls lost because they "sat down to rest." A man by the name of Jim Reeves recorded a song about a man and his horse caught in a blizzard as they headed for home. The horse wanted to stop, but the man knew that if they did it would be death for them both. The man finally gave in to his tired horse, so they stopped to rest, just a hundred yards from home. Later, the man and his horse were found frozen to death. How many times do we stop to take a rest from things spiritually important, when we are so close to eternity?

The way a man lives here will determine where a man lives hereafter. God expects us to endure, persevere unto the end. John wrote, "...be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life" (Rev. 2:10). Jesus said, "And ye shall be hated of all men for my name's sake: but he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved" (Mark 13:13). May God help us so live here, that we may live with Him in the hereafter.

"Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds" (Heb. 12:1-3).




In Exchange

10 Rules for Happier Living


- 1. Give something away (no strings attached).
