

Have you visited our website, or recommended it to a lost soul lately? It is chock full of teaching aids, sermons, and other information to not only help us, but to help us reach the lost.



Samuel Walker wrote a book entitled 212 Degrees. In the book he discussed the difference made by just <u>one</u> degree of additional effort! At 211 degrees water is hot. At 212 degrees it boils. And with the boiling water comes steam. And with steam you can power a train. One degree! Applying one extra degree of temperature to water means the difference between something that is simply very hot and something that generates enough force to power a machine!
