

DANA'S DIRECTION

"The church will grow when . . . "

Several years ago, at a leadership retreat I was attending, Charles Hodge announced that the topic for his series of lessons would be "How to double the church in one year." You should have heard the notebooks snap open! Everybody, it seems, is looking for the secret to church growth. Just tell us what programs we should initiate that will make it happen!

While it is true that most congregations could be better organized and consistent in doing the Lord's work, there isn't really a set "program" that can guarantee the church will grow. Brethren, we are the church! The church grows more because of who we are than it does because of what we do. The church will grow when we as individual Christians grow. When the great church at Jerusalem was scattered by persecution, it did not keep it from growing. Why? Because the individual Christians who were scattered "went everywhere preaching the word" (Acts 8:4). Any congregation of dedicated and enthusiastic Christians will grow, with or without a program. We are the secret to church growth! Brother Hodge made the five following points:

The church will grow when we love. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength; and love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:30-31) People will be drawn to us when they see that we love the Lord; we love them; we love the lost; and we love our church!

The church will grow when we give. Our concern for something is in direct relation to our investment. I'm not really all that concerned for how the IBM Company is doing. That would be different if I worked for them or was a major stock-holder. When we give ourselves to the Lord—totally – there is no question that we will support His church financially. The assets available to the church should be sum total of the assets of its members. If we really believed that – the church would never lack the financial ability or manpower to accomplish any good work.

The church will grow when we promote. When we are really sold on something, we don't have to be persuaded to tell others. We have all known people who were almost evangelistic in their promotion of a particular brand of vitamin or cleaning solution. I met a lady who worked with one of our members. She said "I almost feel that I've been there. All she does is talk about her church!" Each Christian should be an "ambassador for Christ;" a living, walking advertisement for the Lord and His church.

The church will grow when we fellowship. Who wouldn't be drawn by a church that really "feels like family?" A church where members are loved, supported, accepted and cared for. Jesus said "A new commandment I give unto you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35)

The church will grow when we invite people to come. The simplest "program" for church growth, is actually the most effective. When studies have been made of why people have chosen the church to which they belong, the results have been very informative. Yes, a few people have chosen a church because the building is nice or in a convenient location. Some attend where they do because they like the preacher. A few have been drawn because of church activities and programs. But, the vast majority of people in any church are there because of the influence of another member. Somebody invited them to church! This form of evangelism is as old as the church. When Andrew found Jesus, he went and got his brother Peter. Phillip went and got Nathaniel. (John 1:40-51) Who have you invited?

Inviting others is something that we can all do. If we would all just reach out to our own circle of associates, family members, and friends! If every single week we would invite people until somebody agreed to come with us to church! When they come they will be able to see the love, and fellowship, and commitment that we have to the Lord and His church.

This really is the only way the church will grow – one at a time – when each of us lives a life of dedicated service to the Lord.
