DANA'S DIRECTION If you are free—thank a Vet"

Tomorrow, November 11, is Veteran's Day. It will be a day off for some, kids will be out of school, but otherwise, will we even stop to consider its meaning? I saw a bumper sticker the other day that got me thinking. It said "If you are free – thank a Vet."

I grew up in a generation that was surrounded and shaped by veterans. Nearly all of our fathers had fought in the war. The experience had both humbled them and given them pride – to be Americans. They were and taught us to be patriotic. When I was a small boy, I found a ragged old American flag in the shop behind the garage. I was using it to wipe the frost off of a window. I saw a shocked look in my Dad's eyes. He didn't yell at me, he just told me what I didn't understand. Many of his friends had died defending that flag. He taught me how to dispose of a flag with honor and respect.

The men of that generation left jobs, wives, and small children behind; they put their educations on hold. The women went into the factories to make armaments and other supplies necessary to win the war. It was all about winning the war. Extended families moved in together to conserve resources and live more frugally. They did without sugar, flour, meat, gasoline, new clothing and cars. They raised gardens, bought war-bonds, volunteered to do all the jobs in the community that needed done because the young men were away at war.

But what they accomplished by their sacrifice was great! Freedom! Dictators and despots that would have ruled the world were defeated. Not forever, but it allowed for another generation (my generation and the next and another) to live free. I'm afraid we are forgetting. A couple of years ago I was watching a veterans' parade and some young people were laughing about the "old men in funny hats" (veterans). I'm afraid the time will come when we will be called upon to learn these lessons all over again. I just pray it won't be too late.

We are rapidly losing that generation of men and women who secured our freedom. Approximately 600 WWII veterans die each day. We need to say "Thank you." Their ranks are now being replaced by the veterans of the conflicts in Korea, Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan. We need to say "Thank you." Why? Because veterans have been the answer to our prayers – the prayers God has told us to pray.

Paul said that "prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth." (I Timothy 2:1-4)

There were rulers who, in defense of the peace and freedom of the world, were willing to go to war. The men and women of our military have put their lives on the line that we might live quiet and peaceful lives.

This pleases God! Why? Because He wants men to hear the gospel and be saved!

Not only should we thank God for our freedom, we must use that freedom to serve Him and seek the lost. Not only should we thank veterans for our freedom, we should live in such a way that they did not "bear the sword in vain." (Romans 13:4) If you are free—thank a veteran!
