DANA'S DIRECTION Mission Work Emphasis Sunday

We will be privileged this evening to have two men address our assembly that represent mission efforts that we been supporting. They are as follows:

Brother Jon Galloway - Evangelist to Kilbride, Scotland. Brother Galloway has been



known to and supported by the congregation here for many years. Jon is the son of brother Joe Galloway and the nephew of Jim and Charlotte Galloway. He met his wife, Arlene (from Scotland) while they were students at FHU. In 1985 they moved to Scotland where they have been working with the Lord's people in the Glasgow area for the past 28 years. Jon preached for 5 years in Castlemilk, then helped to start a congregation west of Glasgow where he labored for 19 years. He is now in his seventh year with the East Kilbride congregation. He began teaching at the British

Bible School in 1994 and currently serves as the school's Governor.

Brother Ed Jones – FACE – French African Christian Education Foundation. Brother Jones is an elder from the Benton Church of Christ in Benton, Kentucky, and the executive director of FACE. Brother Jay Lockhart recommended this work to us. In

1992 the church in Benton participated in a mission effort in Benin West Africa, when it was learned that the French speaking country of Benin had no churches of Christ in existence. By 1994 when Benin was first visited by Bill Morgan and Ed Jones, elders from the Benton church of Christ, two congregations had been established with about 35 members each. It was the dream of Christians there to start a training center to teach native Africans to preach the gospel and evangelize. In 1998 the Benin Bible Training Center began with 18 students following a three year



course of study. Many students arrived from other French speaking African nations far outgrowing their facilities.

In 2002 18 acres was purchased, and in the years since, eight structures have been built to accommodate 60 students. BTC has graduated 69 preachers and presently has 35 students enrolled. Past graduates represent 10 French speaking nations in West Africa. Many graduates since 1998 have gone back to work with congregations that existed in their home countries, but they have also planted almost 200 new churches with membership approaching 6,000.

Look...But Don't Touch

How many times have you heard in your life, "*it is OK to look…just don't touch?*" As we get older this usually referrers to a man or woman who pauses to admire the physical qualities of someone other than their spouse, girlfriend, or boyfriend, but it can relate to many things. How do you feel about such a statement? Is it Ok to look, as long as you don't act upon the desires that looking may create?

Satan is a trickster and will use anything to try and pull us away from God, even our own flawed logic if we let him. Consider the words James wrote, "But each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed. Then, when desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, brings forth death." (Jas 1:14-15)

Do you see what James is saying to us? It is the natural desires that live within us that Satan twists and abuses to bring about sin in our life. If we allow unchecked desire to turn into sin and grow, then the final result is our spiritual death.

Consider for a moment that there is nothing wrong with having a strong desire for something. We have a desire to eat, there is nothing wrong with that, yet gluttony is a sin. Sleep is a natural desire, but laziness is a sin. Even a strong desire for a physical relationship is natural, but it is to be expressed within the bounds of marriage and nowhere else.

So does that mean if I admire beauty in something or someone it is wrong? Where does *looking* then *become sin?* James says sin is born, when does that happen?

At the point where one simply has desire, there is no sin.

At the point where one is "drawn away" or tempted, there is no sin.

It is when the desire for self-gratification (selfishness) yields to action, **mentally or physically**, that the deadly offspring of sin is born. Look at Rom 8.6ff, Eph 2.1ff, I Jn 5.16.

So, is it OK to look and not touch, after all, I am a Christian and Christians keep clean thoughts? Many think so. The Jews thought a similar thing about murder and adultery, read Matthew 5.21-30. Jesus taught that the path to murder begins in the mind. Anger leads to hate, which leads to action. Likewise, unchecked desire leads to looking, which leads to lust, which in turn leads to actions that can be mental, physical, or both. All are sinful.

Jesus describes a chain of events or a path if you will that leads to unrighteousness. Perhaps it takes a great amount of time for that path to be walked, then again, our thoughts can race ahead of our actions quite literally in the blink of an eye. The wise person will actively look for a path that leads them away from sin, not one that points to it. Is *just looking* a sin? For some, perhaps it is not; but looking can be the first step along a way that leads to it. The choice of where you will travel is yours...choose wisely.
