"Vote and Pray"

Well, we are down to the final days before the 2012 presidential election. By all accounts, this election appears to be one that will be decided by a very narrow margin. I have never, in nearly 40 years of preaching, made what could be construed as "political" statements. I understand that I have brethren that are supportive of the Republican Party, and other brethren who support the Democratic Party. But this year the importance of our choice seems to be greater than ever before.

There are several moral/social issues that are crucial, not only to our nation, but to the role that we, the church, will be permitted to influence our society for God, issues such as abortion and the right to life, the sanctity of marriage versus homosexual unions, and the freedom to practice our faith in God without the interference of government that wishes in many ways to silence any who seek to point out that we are "one Nation Under God."

There has never been a time, in my life-time, that Americans have seemed so divided. The tactics of fear have been used to line up votes for candidates by those who would never support their stand on these moral issues that will define the nature and the future of our nation. The fact that there are those seeking to lead this nation that will say anything and use any fraudulent method to get elected, casts a pall of doubt on the results the election even once the votes have been cast.

I heard a preacher recently proclaim "the outcome of this election will ultimately be determined by prayer." Do we have the faith in God to say "Amen" to that statement? We must remember that God is in charge. "There is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God." (Romans 13:10) "The Most High rules in the kingdom of men, and gives it to whomever He will." (Daniel 4:17) I cannot say what God has determined is best for this country. I know that whenever Israel forgot Him, God allowed other nations to seize them, in order to persuade them to repent. But I also know that we have been commanded to, "Pray for kings and all who are in authority that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior." (I Timothy 2:1)

Maybe, if our election turns out in such a way that compromises our faith, and takes our nation further from God, it will be because we didn't care enough to spend the time leading up to it on our knees! Yes, VOTE - but remember that the greatest power we have to wrestle against the principalities and powers of this world - is the power of prayer.

Going the Extra Mile

I often get questions sent to me in my email. Here is one that I would like to share with you. How would you answer this person?

Q. Where can I find verses on going the extra mile and what does Jesus mean by saying this?

The primary verse people think of concerning *going the extra mile* is found in Matthew 5.41-42.

Take a moment to look at the principle Jesus was teaching in this passage. Verses 38-39 say:

(38) "You have heard that it was said, 'AN EYE FOR AN EYE AND A TOOTH FOR A TOOTH.' (39) But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also.

Jesus is teaching that it is better to not resist an evil person than it is to fight back and cause further strife. Anger and fighting back just makes the problem bigger. If we let revenge get into our heart, then we are no better than that evil person.

This does not mean we have to let people abuse us or take advantage of us. Joseph ran from evil when Potiphar's wife tried to seduce him. Paul tells Timothy to flee evil things (I Tim 6.11, II Tim 2.22).

Jesus does not want His people to harbor hate or revenge in their hearts toward others. Instead, He wants us to show others love and kindness. This is why he tells the Jews, And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two. (Mt 5.41). Even if a cruel Roman soldier made them carry a heavy pack for a mile, volunteer to go two. Wow! I wonder what that soldier would have thought when someone showed that kind of love and cooperation.

In verse 42, Christ instructs His people to give to those in need, without expecting anything in return. This is the attitude of a person who goes the extra mile.

Some other verses to consider:

- Jesus teaches forgiveness to those who are wicked (Lk 23.34).
- Stephen follows the example of Christ (Acts 7.60).
- Luke records Jesus teaching love and going the extra mile (Lk 6.27-31), Proverbs 19.17, Rom 12.17-21
