Though it makes a difference to someone, whether a sports team wins a tournament or championship has no effect on my life. Not even on my emotional scale.

Jesus rose from the dead. This is a fact, like the announcement of the winning team of a playoff. But more than a fact, it is a truth. A significant truth. A transforming truth. As Paul said, "And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (I Corinthians 15:14 ESV).

The truth that Jesus was raised from the grave demands action. The first time this truth was spoken, an angel hurried two disciples out of the tomb.

"He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. See, I have told you" (Matthew 28:6-7).

This truth yanks a fisherman back away from the nets. This truth turns moping and mourning into joy. This truth converts a listless saint into white hot running.

Because this truth changes the whole game. It explodes the locked door of death. It blows away the mists of eternity. It locks down the hope of a happy future. It guarantees our follow-up experience.

"If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you" (Romans 8:11).

Crumbling Home Fronts

America's ambassador to Japan, Douglas MacArthur II, served as Counselor of the State Department under John Foster Dulles. Like Dulles, MacArthur was a hard worker. Once when Dulles telephoned the MacArthur home asking for Douglas, Mrs. MacArthur mistook him for an aide and snapped irately, "MacArthur is where MacArthur always is, weekdays, Saturdays, Sundays, and nights – in that office!"

Within minutes, MacArthur got a telephone order from Dulles: "Go home at once, boy. Your home front is crumbling." (Source Unknown)

In fact, many home fronts are crumbling away across our nation because spouses do not spend enough time with each other or their children. Parents often work two or three jobs while at the same time making sure the homework gets done, the children are engaged in sports, scouts, or other interests. To be honest, they don't even spend much time in the same room together, and family meals around the supper table have become a relic of a bygone era

A couple can become more like roommates than husband and wife, spending more time with everything else in life than they do with each other.

Love is a decision to be made and nourished, not just a feeling to be shared once and a while (Eph 5.22-23). A husband *must* love his wife as much as he cares for himself and wives *must* give respect to their husband in the same manner.

God instructs couples to *enjoy* one another (Prov 5.15-19). How can they do that if they do not willingly build their relationship through mutual love?

Parents are to love their children and in truth, most do. Their love however, must go beyond providing for their physical growth and driving them to their games before making sure the homework is done and finally collapsing into bed, exhausted.

Godly parents show true love to their children by bringing God into their homes and making Him the center of it (Eph 6.4, Mt 10.37, Deut 6.4-9).

As God's people, we have to turn to Him and His way for living our lives. We will be happier when we do. It is time for families across the nation to shore up our foundations, strengthen our homes, reunite with our spouses, and provide our children with the greatest gift of all, a personal relationship with God who loves them deeper than we ever could.

FEATURED BOOK OF THE WEEK...

BAPTISM *in the* New Testament

One fact that every reader should be aware of is that every writer has a prejudice. So it seems that a Baptist scholar would advocate baptism as a sign of already being saved. However, the British Baptist theologian, G.R. Beasley-Murray has written the definitive work on <u>Baptism in the New Testament.</u>

The six chapters are not for the causal reader. Beasley-Murray starts with antecedents of Christian Baptism. He moves to the Foundation of Christian Baptism. Time is devoted to examining the Acts of the Apostles.

A lengthy development is made of New Testament scriptures dealing with Baptism beginning with Pauline Literature, followed by Johannine Literature and concluding with Hebrews and Peter.

Chapter five makes the connection between Christian Baptism and other New Testament Doctrines of Grace, Faith, the Spirit, the Church, Ethics, Hope and finally, the Necessity of Baptism.

The sixth and final chapter investigates "the Rise and Significance of Infant Baptism." Since baptism is necessary for salvation, and in view of the fact that most people do not understand, it is imperative for us as New Testament Christians to comprehend all the facets of baptism. Therefore, this book is highly recommended.
