BROTHERLY KINDNESS

When I think of brotherly kindness I think of Jesus Christ. If the truth were known, his acts of kindness would be numberless. But the Scriptures do attempt to give us a picture of this virtue on the life of our Lord. Brotherly kindness was shown when Jesus fed the hungry multitudes; when he healed the lame and blind; when he showed compassion in raising the son of the widow of Nain from the dead; when he cried at the tomb of Lazarus.

As great as these acts of kindness were, his greatest act was the sharing of his saving message to the world which he made possible by dying at Calvary. Without that one act of kindness, we would still be lost in sin.

It goes without saying that we should always demonstrate this virtue in our lives. Most of us can be kind as long as things go smoothly. It's when we're tested that we know whether or not we have the virtue.

If you truly have brotherly kindness you:

- 1. Will not respond negatively to another's offenses, but you will turn the other cheek.
- 2. Will not take revenge into your own hands because it belongs to God.
- 3. Will not spread damaging gossip about others whether it is true or not!
- 4. Will not hold grudges, but will forgive and forget.
- 5. Will give your brother the benefit of the doubt.

As Paul put it, showing brotherly kindness is "bearing with one another, and forgiving each other . . . Just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you" (Col. 3:13).

Can Two Walk Together... Even When They Are Agreed?

The Old Testament prophet, Amos, once asked the rhetorical question to the nation of Israel, "Can two walk together, unless they are agreed?" The answer is obvious and the lesson is clear. If the Israelites wanted to walk with God, they had to be in agreement with God. Agreement is essential. Those who find themselves disagreeing with God in doctrine and practice, yet claim close fellowship with him have deceived themselves and need to be reminded of these words from the prophet, Amos.

While agreement is absolutely essential in order for two to walk together, through observation, I see that while agreement is essential, it is not sufficient. I have witnessed churches and individuals divide, though they were in agreement. How can this be? The answer is in attitudes.

Christianity is much more than doctrinal or theological positions. Grant it, doctrine is vitally important. Holding fast to the doctrine of Christ will not only save our souls, but the souls of those who hear us (1 Timothy 4:16). But Christianity is more than holding correct doctrine. It involves attitudes and it involves motives.

For example, have you ever seen the cause of Christ suffer because of an unforgiving spirit? Though the offender and the offended agree doctrinally, the offended person doesn't find room in his heart to forgive. The result; brethren walk their separate ways.

Have you ever seen the cause of Christ suffer because of pride? A brother cannot humble himself to repent for wrongs afflicted intentionally or unintentionally upon a brother. The result; brethren walk their separate ways.

Have you ever seen the cause of Christ suffer because of the desire for power? Some brother doesn't get his way, so he withdraws his help, support, and resources. The result; brethren walk their separate ways.

We need to listen to and heed the words of the prophet Amos. We cannot walk or have fellowship with God unless we agree. But even further, we cannot walk together with our brethren unless we possess the proper attitudes of humility, forgiveness, and patience.



One Sunday a preacher was entertained in a farm home of a family of a rural church. The preacher was impressed by the intelligence and unusually good behavior of their only child, a little four-year-old boy. Then the preacher discovered one reason for the child's charm. The mother was at the kitchen sink, washing the intricate parts of the cream separator when the little boy came to her with a magazine. "Mother," he asked, "what is this man in the picture doing?" To the preacher's surprise, she dried her hands, sat down on a chair, and taking the boy in her lap she spent several minutes answering her son's questions.

After the child had left, the preacher commented on her having interrupted her chores to answer the boy's questions, saying, "Most mothers wouldn't have been bothered."

"I expect to be washing cream separators for the rest of my life," she told the preacher, "but never again will my son ask me that question."

"A child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame" (Proverbs 29:15).

The Impala is an African antelope with a super-charged spring. It has a vertical leap of over



ten feet and can broad jump over thirty feet. You would think that the zoos of the world would find it impossible to keep such an animal enclosed. But that is not so!

Experts have discovered something about the Impala: It will not jump unless it can see where it is going to land. Therefore, a solid wall even six feet tall is a sufficient enclosure.

Lots of Christians have the Impala's problem. They won't jump into any new work unless they have all the answers in advance about where that decision will take them. But God is looking for some bold believers who, even in the face of the unknown, will leap when the Bible says jump! We need to remember that if God is for us, who can be against us? Jesus reinforced this thinking when He told Simon Peter, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets" (Luke 5:4). We need to take God at His word and jump - even when we can't see where we will land!
