DANA'S DIRECTION "Our precious young people"



According to research done within our brotherhood, 45 percent of our teens leave the churches of Christ. This is a horrible drain, and it means that we are doing something wrong. A directive put out by Abilene Christian University stated that our youth ministry programs have emphasized entertainment and have had "little or no theological grounding." The article suggested that "if teenagers regularly engaged in prayer, meditation on scripture, confession, praise, and praying, over the lost - you can be much more sure that Christ is making a difference in their lives."

Among other positive factors they listed were their "parents' spiritual commitment, good family communication, and church attendance."

Surprisingly, in the survey, one of the negatives was the family's income. The greater the family affluence, the less willing a teenager is to rely on Jesus Christ. The bare fact of the matter, however, is that, whatever the cause, we are losing enormous numbers of our young people.

Parents, let me speak to you. What can you do? May I be so bold as to suggest that you reevaluate your own goals in life? If your goal is "affluence," you are likely working against the spiritual wellbeing of your people. They can see this, and nothing you say, or command, or require of your children is going to change this. On the other side of the coin, if our goal is spirituality, and if your young people can see real spiritual commitment in your lives, constant family communication about the church, and the kind of attendance pattern that says that the church is the number one priority in your lives, the chances of their being faithful will increase. When I noticed that we are losing 45 percent of our young people, I looked at our attendance figures and noticed that 42 percent of our young people do not attend Sunday evening services. Do you suppose there might be a connection?

What Did They Say?!

I was recently asked a simple Bible question from a sincere young lady concerning the subject of cursing and profanity.

"I know the Bible talks about not taking the Lord's name in vain", she said, "but how do we really *know* what bad language is?" This is actually quite an intelligent question from one of our young people and one that may be more difficult to answer than you might believe.

The Bible does not provide us with a handy list of which words or phrases that are to be avoided. How could it? Our language changes over time. For instance, would you be offended if someone asked you if you are feeling 'gay' this morning? To be gay is to be happy or carefree...or is it? You see, words change meaning.

Thankfully, God does not leave us without guidance. The Bible warns against evil uses of language. Consider that words convey ideas and reveal a person's heart. Therefore it is the idea associated with a word or phrase that can create a sinful pattern in speech.

The scriptures speak of "filthy" or "foolish" talking in Eph 5.4. The word *filthy* entails behavior that flouts social and moral standards, shamefulness, and obscenity. Paul warns of using "filthy language" (Col 3.8); a kind that is generally considered in poor taste, obscene, or dirty talk. The words of emptiness that Peter speaks of, (2 Pet 2.18) refer to those that conjure up illicit sexual images and ideas (lasciviousness). "Corrupt" communication is morally unwholesome and harmful speech. (Eph 4.29) "Foolish talking" is quite literally moronic speech that reveals a stupid mind, while "jesting" suggests off-color jokes or humor. (Eph 5.4)

So we see, while the Bible does not say "Thou shall not say common curse words", it does clearly warn us about them and many other uses of language that are sinful.

Food for thought:

What about euphemisms? When we say things like "Oh my (blank), or "gosh" are we really fooling anyone? People can fill in the blanks or interpret substitute words as fast as we can say them, they are not dumb. Cursing through substitution is still cursing, and is condemned by God in scripture.

Our young people sure are observant. Thank you for this great question.

Did you know that one of the biggest miracles in the world occurred when the children of Israel wandered in the wilderness for 40 years? They had to be fed! And the approximately 3 million people would have required a lot of food!

According to the Quartermaster General of the Army, it would have required over 1,500 tons of food each day. If it were today's Army, that would require two freight trains, each a mile long, to bring each day's rations. They would also need water. If they had only enough to drink, it would take 3 million gallons daily. This would require another freight train 2 miles long. Did Moses figure all of this out before they left Egypt? No, he simply believed in God, and God took care of them.
