

Our guest speaker this morning is Brother Harold Shank, who serves as President of Ohio Valley University.

Before coming to OVU, he was Professor of Old Testament at Oklahoma Christian University and Reviews Editor of the *Christian Chronicle*.

Since 1996 he has also been the national spokesperson for Christian Child and Family Services Association. This organization represents about 70 childcare agencies across the nation.

Brother Shank has written several books including Listening to His Heartbeat - What the Bible says about the Heart of God (College Press, 2009), Loosening Your Grip (1995), Up Close and Personal - Embracing the Poor (2000), Children Mean the World to God (2001), College Press NIV Commentary of the Minor Prophets (2001), and It's All About God (2004).

Harold is interested in children and young people. He also champions ministries to the poor and vulnerable. He writes and speaks about these topics frequently. He is a member of the Society of Biblical Literature.

Brother Shank is married to Sally Jane. They have two sons: Daniel and Nathan. For the last several years they attended Memorial Road Church of Christ where Brother Shank served as an elder.

He is a graduate of Oklahoma Christian with a B.A. in Bible. He received his M.A. and M.A.R. from Harding University Graduate School of Religion. His Ph.D. in Theology is from Marquette University.

Brother Shank was part of a team that planted the Northtown congregation in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and later served as the preacher for the Highland Church of Christ in Memphis, Tennessee for twenty years.

Originally from Indiana, Pennsylvania, his family came to Christ when he was a teenager.



For This Cause

"Pilate therefore said to Him, 'Are You a king then?' Jesus answered, 'You say rightly that I am a king. For this cause I was born, and for this cause I have come into the world, that I should bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice'" (John 18:37). The advent of Christ was not a mistake, happenstance, or coincidence. He came into the world for a point and purpose.

Jesus came to be King. Old Testament prophecies stated that one would come from the line of David; one who would rule over his own kingdom (2 Samuel 7:12-16; Psalms 132:11). Peter made the connection between the prophecies of a king and Jesus of Nazareth, whom God made both "Lord and Christ" (Acts 2:29-36). Therefore, the Bible refers to Jesus as King of kings and Lord of lords (1 Timothy 6:15).

Notice, Jesus told Pilate He came into the world for the purpose of being King. Some believe Jesus failed in His mission. They say His kingdom will be established at some point in the future and last for 1,000 years. Do not be disheartened, these people are wrong. The Lord of lords did not falter or fail. He is now king of righteousness and king of peace (Hebrews 6:19-7:2). He now rules and reigns at the right hand of God and will do so until His return (1 Corinthians 15:23-28). For this cause He came into the world.


Jesus also came to bear witness to the truth. Being the Word of God He was the embodiment of truth (John 1:1, 14, 17). He said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). Jesus taught the word of God, which is truth that convicts and saves (John 7:16; 17:17; 15:22; 8:32). It would seem automatic that all men would come to the truth for salvation, but many will not (John 3:19-21).

There are a few precious souls that seek for and accept the truth, who are "of the truth" and hear His voice. They are ones who "will to do His will" (John 7:17). They come to the light that their deeds may be exposed (John 3:19-21). Most others, however, shun the truth, hate it and the one who brings it (cf. John 15:18-25). Even so, we must be like our Lord and "bear witness" to the truth.

Jesus was and is the King of truth. For this cause He was born into the world. Let us support Him in this cause.
