

The Power of an Invitation

U You're Invited...

Dr. Harold Shank, the President of Ohio Valley University, tells the story of his introduction to Christianity. When he was just a boy his family did not attend church. A neighbor invited Harold to Vacation Bible School at the local church of Christ. He enjoyed it so much that it was suggested he might enjoy coming to Bible class and church services on Sundays and Wednesday nights. He did.

This early invitation led to the conversion of his family, study at Christian university, becoming an educator, over thirty-five years in ministry, teaching Bible and now serving in the very important role of leading OVU - all because one Christian invited a little boy to Vacation Bible School.

I am reminded of the apostle Andrew. We are not really told much about Andrew's success as an evangelist – but one thing we are told – he brought his brother Peter to Christ, and his contribution to the church of the first century was great. We may not have the talent or the opportunity to be leaders in the church, but we can – all of us – show interest in the souls of loved ones, neighbors and friends, by inviting them to church.

Family and Friend's Day - Camden Ave. 500

Next Sunday – May 27th. We have set an attendance goal of 500 for our Family and Friend's Day this year. Will we reach that goal? I don't know, but I do know that every one that attends will be blessed with the opportunity to worship and have fellowship with a faithful congregation of the Lord's church. I also know that each of us working together can make next Sunday a very special day for the church at Camden Ave.

Have you invited anyone yet? It's not too late! You may be wondering "Who should I ask?" Don't overlook anyone who potentially may come. **Have you considered**:

• Mothers and Fathers, brothers, sisters, aunts and uncles, cousins and their families? If your family is like most, we don't get together as often as we wish, going to church together is a wonderful opportunity – they will learn more about your faith in the process.

• **People you grew up with** – especially those you grew up with in the church? Many of them have not remained faithful through the years – this may be the first step back for them!

• **People who share common interests?** The guys who go 4-wheeling with you, the retiree's group that meets for breakfast once a month. The other moms and dads who participate in your kid's ball teams or school activities.

• **People you interact with daily?** The people at work. The man who cuts your hair, the clerk at the grocery store, the family in the neighborhood whose kids play with your kids, the older couple that lives across the street.

• You can invite people that you don't even know. Take some of the flyers and post them on public bulletin boards at work or in the post office or the grocery store. Come tomorrow night and help us pass them out in our neighborhood. We may not reach our goal of 500 – but one thing is sure – people will not come unless we invite them!

When a person works an eight-hour day and receives a fair day's pay for this time, that is called a WAGE.

When a person competes with an opponent and receives a trophy for his performance, that is called a PRIZE.

When a person receives appropriate recognition for his long service or high achievements, that is called an AWARD.

But when a person is not capable of earning wage, can win no prize, and deserves no award - yet receives such a gift anyway - that is

GRACE. That is what we mean when we talk about the grace of God.

"For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast" (Ephesians 2:8-10)

God loves you and God loves me. And by His grace He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to die for our sins. Even when we didn't deserve it!

Ask yourself this question. "Does my apparel bring honor to God or bring attention to myself?" I believe this principle if answered honestly will ensure that God's people are properly clothed.
