

DANA'S DIRECTION "RESURRECTION POWER"

There is a large stone tomb in Hanover, Germany. The tomb, over 170 years old, is made from large slabs of stone, bound together by bands of iron. It is capped with a huge stone block weighing more than a ton. The inscription reads, "This Grave is Purchased for Eternity: It Shall Never be Opened."

Somehow, though, a small poplar seed was enclosed in the tomb's mold. The seed grew. The slender shoot found its way through a narrow crevice between the huge stone slabs. As it grew into a stately tree, it broke the iron bands and moved every stone from its original place. **The power of a seed; resurrection power!**

The power of resurrection was certainly seen when life was restored to the dead body of our Lord; the power that broke the iron bands of death; the power that rolled the stone away. The resurrection of Jesus is God's revelation that nothing can defeat His plan for the redemption of man. It is also historic proof that Satan cannot defeat those who belong to Him. The resurrection is divine revelation that a new day of victory will dawn out of the hour of darkest despair. God is in control. He will bring all men into judgment; He will right every wrong. He will reward those who remain faithful. How do we know? "Because He has appointed a day on which He will judge the world in righteousness by the Man whom He has ordained. He has given assurance of this to all by raising Him from the dead." (Acts 17:31)

The Lord's resurrection is essential to our hope of salvation. "If Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins! Then also those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most pitiable. But now Christ is risen from the dead!" (I Corinthians 15:17-19)

There is another resurrection that is essential to our salvation – ours! We too, as Jesus, must die. We must die to sin. Like Jesus, we must be buried – in the water of baptism. And, as Jesus "was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, certainly we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection" (Romans 6:1-5).

The power of this spiritual rebirth is found in the power of the seed. Jesus tells us that the "seed is the word of God." (Luke 8:11) When the story of the gospel (that "Christ died for our sins, according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He arose again the third day according to the Scriptures" (I Corinthians 15: 2-4)) takes root in a 'good and honest heart' it produces the spiritual life of faith. (Romans 10:17) Repentance puts to death the old man of sin. Baptism washes away the stain of sin. The obedient believer arises from the tomb of spiritual death and is resurrected as a new creature in Christ. The power of this spiritual resurrection is the power to change! The power to overcome sin! The power to become like Christ! Paul stated, "that I might know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death." (Philippians 3:10)

Having died to sin and being resurrected spiritually prepares us for one final resurrection – in the Last Day, as Paul continues "if, by any means, I may attain to the resurrection from the dead." (Philippians 3:11) "For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first." (I Thessalonians 4:16)

So you see, there is hope in death – the hope of the resurrection! Jesus gave us that hope when He came forth from the grave. We gained that hope when we obeyed the gospel. We will realize that hope in the Last Day. Jesus told us "I am the resurrection and the life, He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. . . Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26)

GOSPEL MEETING WITH JOHN MILLER APRIL 19–22

Are Gospel Meetings a thing of the past? This question has been asked by Elders in local congregations in recent years.

In past years Gospel Meetings have been very effective in reaching the lost. Many have been strengthened through preaching the word, but still the question is asked.

It is true in most congregations, 30—40 percent of members don't support their own Gospel Meeting. Why? We need to analyze the purpose of Gospel Meetings to answer the question. There are four basic reasons for Gospel Meetings.

First, there is opportunity to worship and praise God and God desires this. True worshipers worship him in spirit and truth, John 4:23—24.

During a Gospel Meeting we glorify God in song, prayer and study of His Holy Word. Don't you want to worship God?

Second, we have opportunity to study God's word, as Christians we should "Hunger and thirst after righteousness" Matthew 5:6. "We should desire the word so we might grow" I Peter 2:20. Don't you want to know God's will for your life?

Third, during Gospel Meeting the lost are admonished to repent and obey God to be saved. The opportunity to respond to Jesus' loving invitation, erring Christians are motivated to repent and be restored.

Don't you want to see the lost saved? Don't you want to see a brother or sister restored?

Fourth, through Gospel Meetings the overall church can be strengthened spiritually. The saved are encouraged to remain faithful and strong. Knowledge will be increased. Our zeal to serve rekindled. Our sense of urgency can be stirred up.

Don't you want to grow in faith and be stronger spiritually? John will do his part. May we do ours!
