DANA'S DIRECTION



Seek out from among you...

Today we are beginning the very important process of choosing additional men to serve in the leadership of the church here at Camden Avenue. The men of the congregation, along with our current elders, saw this need and addressed it as one of our goals for 2015. The seriousness of this process is sobering because it will affect the spiritual health of our congregation both now and in the future.

The New Testament is very adamant of the need for every congregation to have men to oversee it. Paul told Titus "For this reason I left you in Crete, that you should set in order the things that are lacking, and appoint elders in every city as I commanded you" (Titus 1:5). Camden Avenue is unique in one way from nearly every other congregation that I know of; we have had an established eldership from the very beginning of our existence. I know of many congregations that have existed 30-40 years and more that have never selected men to serve in this role and it becomes apparent over the years that something truly is lacking. I believe this is one reason that the congregation here has generally prospered and been at peace.

God has not left us on our own in this process. Paul reminded the elders from the church at Ephesus that the Holy Spirit had made them overseers of the church – He still does today. God identifies the men He desires to serve in this role by describing the qualities or qualifications they must possess (I Timothy 3:1-7; Titus 1:5-11). It is our responsibility to determine which men meet these qualifications. As the apostles first began organizing the efforts of the church in Jerusalem they stated, "Therefore brethren, seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom that we may appoint over this business" (Acts 6:3). This is the process God intends for us to use in selecting men to serve as our elders. We know the men who meet the qualities God has stipulated. We must select men that we respect for their spiritual maturity, love for the Lord and for this congregation. We must select men that we are willing to follow. "Remember those who rule over you in the Lord...whose faith follow" (Hebrews 13:8). We must select men to whom we trust the care of our souls. "Obey those who rule over you and be submissive, for they watch for your souls, as those who must give account" (Hebrews 13:17).

Both of today's sermons will focus on the selecting men to be added to our eldership. The morning sermon, entitled "What's my line?" is intended to give us a better understanding of work of an eldership. Although we generally refer to our leaders as "Elders," there are three different words used in the Greek New Testament to describe who these men are and their role. These three Greek words are translated by six different English words; elder, presbyter, bishop, overseer, pastor and shepherd. Being an elder is not a title or an office as much as it is a work (I Timothy 3:1).

Sunday evening we will be studying in some depth the qualifications for elders as they are listed in I Timothy 3 and Titus 1. You will be given a copy of a form to follow as we study. All of these qualifications are important. Some of them assume that you know the men you are recommending personally. We suggest that you first speak to the person you are considering to see if they are willing to serve. Then after reflection and prayer fill our your selection sheet and hand it in to one of our current elders. In a few weeks our elders will speak to the men whose names are put forth and begin the process of putting them forward for the congregation's consideration. If there are no scriptural reasons to prohibit it, these men will be added to the leadership of the Lord's family here at Camden Avenue.

We pray for God's guidance and blessing in this process.
