

What was happening in August, 1966? Lyndon Johnson was in the White House and both the Vietnam War and Protest movements were growing. The Sound of Music was at the theater. Average cost of a new house was \$14,200; a new car \$2650. Gasoline was 32 cents a gallon. Pampers were the first disposable diaper and "Rock Em – Sock Em Robots" were big on Christmas wish lists.

Wallace Skipper was the new preacher at Camden Avenue church of Christ. Brothers Newberry, Watson, Vaught, Summers and Stanley served as elders. Lois Eaton (Nulter) was church secretary, and yes, Wes Cochran was hired to serve as full time church custodian... which means he is now beginning his 50th year in that capacity!

Wes's dedication to the congregation here at Camden Avenue encompasses a life-time. In 1953 Elsie Cochran was baptized and began bringing her daughter Linda (Camp), and two little three-year-old twin boys, Wes and Les. Camden Avenue has been Wes's church family for sixty-six years! Wes and his brother were baptized the same Sunday evening by Earl Stevens when they were 16. At 19, Wes was hired to serve as custodian.

It is hard to find words that describe Wes's contribution to the Camden Avenue congregation. He has been a friend and a beloved brother in Christ to all. He has set up, served and cleaned up after countless weddings and funerals of our members. He has been the first one to come and the last one to leave in nearly fifty years of the church's assemblies. He has been active as a care-group leader, active in visitation efforts, and the keeper of all records relating to the church at Camden Avenue. He has an amazing memory of people and events. If it happened at Camden Avenue he likely can tell you the details. He is the unofficial historian of our church.

There are many other ways that Wes serves this congregation that you may or may not be aware of. He is an excellent cook and has fixed food for funerals and for shut-ins. He provided the meal for several years of Monday Night for the Master. He knows the heartbeat of the church. If there is a need or a problem in the congregation, Wes is generally one of the first to be aware of it. As a preacher, I have leaned upon Wes on many occasions. He is supportive and encouraging. He loves the Lord and the Camden Avenue church of Christ. What many do not realize – for the past two years, Wes has been volunteering his services. You may not have realized that because he is still here every day, doing what he has been doing for almost fifty years!

While the church has been the primary focus of Wes's, it is certainly not his only interest. Wes is a recognized authority in genealogy. He has been the president of the West Virginia Genealogical Society. If you go into the West Virginia State Archives library, you will see a whole section of the books of research that he has authored. If you have any questions about your West Virginia heritage, Ask Wes!

Wes is dedicated to his family. He cared for his parents when they were elderly, and continues to take an active role in the lives of his brother, sister, nieces and nephews. He is an avid sports fan, especially when it comes to Parkersburg South teams, both boys and girls.


