A TRIBUTE TO JOSEPH MACK LYON

Joseph Mack Lyon was born November 19, 1921 to Earl C. Lyon and Inez Weatherby Lyon in Muskogee, Oklahoma. He departed this life at his home August 5, 2015 at the age of 93.

He was a graduate of Coalgate, Oklahoma High School. He attended Freed-Hardeman University in Henderson, Tennessee and earned his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Oklahoma some years later.

Mack was preceded in death by his father and mother, his sister Earlene Adams, his brother Bill Lyon and his sister Erma Siegworth. Also, his wife of fifty-three years Golda Eaton Lyon passed away in 1996.

He is survived by his wife Lois Duncan Lyon, daughter Jo Ann Lyon of Oklahoma City, son Chris Lyon and daughter-in-law Glenna Lyon of Van Buren, AR, son-in-law and stepdaughter Butch and Jill Wallace of Tallahassee, FL, stepson and daughter-in-law Tim and Kayla Duncan of Orlando, FL. He is also survived by numerous grandchildren and great grandchildren as well as nieces and nephews.

Mack began preaching in Coalgate, OK November 12, 1939 at the age of 17 and he never looked back. He and his family spent almost three years as missionaries in Perth, Western Australia in the 1960s. After returning home he continued local ministry and in the 1980's he began IN SEARCH OF THE LORD'S WAY, a television/media ministry now overseen by the Edmond, OK church of Christ, with outreach around the globe.

He loved the Bible passage: "And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who hath enabled me, for that he counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry." 1 Timothy 1:12

His memorial service was held Wednesday at the Edmond church of Christ.



DANA'S DIRECTION

"When You Miss a Service - You Miss a lot!"

Years ago, I used to listen to the daily program of a news commentator on the radio. During the day, the program was promoted by the catch line "if you miss a day – you miss a lot." If that is true of a radio program, it is certainly true of every opportunity that we have to be in the services of the church!

When asked "Why a Christian should faithfully attend the worship services of the church?" the best answer that many can give is "because it is commanded." Well, it is true that God expects us to be faithful to the assembly of the saints. "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much more as you see the Day approaching." (Hebrews 10:25) But, is the fact that it is commanded our highest motivation?

Asking if "Christians have to attend all of the services of the church?" is, sort of kin to asking "do I have to go home and have dinner with my family each night?" If one has a loving family at home, where else would they want to be? Yes, God has said not to forsake the assembly, but for the conscientious Christian, who loves the Lord and his brothers and sisters in Christ, where else would they want to be? I have been asked, "Where does it say that I have to attend on Sunday night or on Wednesday night?" I like to look at the example of the early church (Acts 2:46-47) and ask "Where does it say that we should no longer be together daily?"

When we miss any service of the church, Sunday morning, Sunday night, Midweek Bible study, Gospel Meetings, etc., - we really do miss a lot! Consider the following things you miss when you fail to assemble with your Christian family:

- * When you miss the Lord's Day, you miss being with the Lord and your brethren as they surround the Lord's table. Jesus told us when He instituted the supper that He would take it with us in the kingdom. (Matthew 26:29)
- * When you miss any service, you miss the opportunity to be with the Lord in a unique and special way. He also said "Where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there in the midst of them." (Matthew 18:20)
- * You can sing by yourself (although it is doubtful that you do), but you miss the opportunity to join your voice with others being taught and admonished by the words that you sing. (Ephesians 5:19)
- * You miss the opportunity for an organized and prepared study of the scriptures.
- * When you don't attend, you fail to receive the encouragement of other Christians as they admonish one another and "stir one another up to love and good works." (Hebrews 10:24)
- * When you forsake the assembling of the saints, can it be truly said that you are "seeking first the kingdom of God and His righteousness?" (Matthew 6:33)

* How can you "let your light shine before men" (Matthew 5:16) and "be an example to the believers" (I Timothy 4:12) if the church isn't more important than the things of the world that keep many away.

When you, without any true cause, forsake the assembling of the saints, you are actually guilty of committing a "willful sin." (Hebrews 10:28) Consider your choices in light of James 4:17 "Therefore to him who knows to do good and does not do it, to him it is sin."

Sermon Notes





Mack Lyon who became known all over the world for his religious TV program "In Search of the Lord's Way", passed away August 5, 2015.

Mack Lyon's son, Chris Lyon, said his father's Edmond based television/radio ministry was the fulfillment of a promise he made to the Lord.

He said growing up in Coalgate, his father and his family regularly listened to a wind powered radio. Chris Lyon said his dad converted to Christianity when he was about 17 years old after listening to the powerful preaching of a Dallas-based Church of Christ evangelist on the radio.

"He told the Lord that if He would allow him to live to be a man, he would use the media to preach the Gospel, and he did," Chris Lyon said.

He and Mack Lyon's longtime friend, Phil Sanders said "In Search of the Lord's Way" is now available in all TV markets in the United States, including Hawaii and Alaska, plus places such as Korea, Mexico, Iceland, Canada and New Zealand.

The TV show's broad reach, plus radio and Internet segments, made Mack Lyon one of the most visible televangelists in the world and a prominent figure within the Churches of Christ. Sanders said, "In Search Of The Lord's Way" is the largest media ministry in the history of the Churches of Christ. "Today, more than 100 million households can see it," he said.

Chris Lyon, who is the ministry's director of operations, said his father's show became popular because of his preaching. "What he said was always backed by Scripture. His whole life was based on reaching out and telling people the simple message of Jesus Christ," Chris Lyon said.

Sanders, who succeeded Mack Lyon on "In Search of the Lord's Way" in 2009, said his mentor didn't try to be anything other than a minister imparting the Gospel.


Thanks to all the blood donors. We ended up with credit of 26 out of a goal of 39. The church family was only responsible for 15 of the 26 collected.


