DANA'S DIRECTION

"Learning from Shepherds"

A young preacher I have known for many years called me the other day to discuss some difficulties that he has been having in his ministry. The church where he preaches has only two elders, one of whom considers himself "in charge." When expressing some concerns he was told by this man "I am the elder, you will do what I say." While not knowing any particulars, I believe this young preacher is sincere and wants only to serve the Lord. The shame is that those responsible for leading the church are not always of the same mind.

This is not to question the authority of elders. (Hebrews 13:7,17) We should realize that God has given this authority to the eldership as a group. (I Timothy 4:14) An elder, apart from that group, has no more authority than any other man in the church. The eldership, however, of which he is a part, speaks with the authority of God.

There are several words given in scripture for the spiritual leaders of the church: elders, bishops, pastors, shepherds, etc. I believe the spirit of leadership that God wishes for the church is embodied in the word shepherd. It is the only one of these terms that Jesus uses to describe Himself: "I am the good shepherd." (John 10:11) Peter refers to Jesus as the "chief shepherd" to whom all other shepherds must give an account. (I Peter 1:1-4)

The people in biblical times and places understood the role of shepherds much better than we. Shepherds were totally responsible for the care of their master's sheep. Jesus went on to say "the good shepherd gives his life for the sheep." (John 10:11) God refers to His people as His flock. (Psalm 95:7) The responsibility of spiritual oversight of God's people is compared to the role of a shepherd. "Therefore, take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd (feed KJV) the church of God, which He purchased with His own blood." (Acts 20:28)

How do shepherds lead their flock? The word lead is the key. Sheep must be led, not driven. "Nor as being lords over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock." (I Peter 5:3) Jesus speaks of the loving, personal relationship that exists between shepherds and their sheep "the sheep hear his voice; and he calls out his own sheep by name and leads them out. He goes before them; and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice." (John 10:3-4) Shepherds make sure that their sheep are properly fed and watered. When they are sick or injured, the shepherd tends to them. If they wander away, the shepherd goes in search for them. Shepherds are responsible – they must give account for every sheep within their care.

That is the model that God has given to those who are responsible for "the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand." (Psalm 95:7) Shepherds (elders) are responsible for the souls of those that they lead. (Hebrews 13:17) They must make sure that the church is properly taught (fed) and protected from false teaching that would lead them astray. Shepherds (elders) have a responsibility to know those they are leading. When individual Christians are hurt, or weak, or go astray, shepherds must be there for them. As Jesus said, a "good shepherd gives his life for the sheep." I can't imagine a person trying to serve as an elder along with many other leadership roles in the community. President Garfield (a Christian and an elder in the church), said when he became President, "I must step down from the most important job on earth."

God will hold shepherds accountable for their role in leading His sheep. God rebuked the shepherds of Israel that were more interested in themselves than caring for His flock; "The weak you have not strengthened, nor have you healed those who were sick, nor bound up the broken, nor brought back what was driven away, nor sought what was lost: but with force and cruelty you have ruled them. So they were scattered because there was no shepherd!" (Ezekiel 34:4-5)



What Will You Take With You?

You home is flooding because the river near you has burst its banks. A small rescue boat is waiting outside while you gather a few precious belongings. What will you take with you?

A forest fire rages and races towards your home in a hot dry area. You have 10 minutes to grab whatever you can and safely get out of the danger zone. What will you choose to take with you? What would you latch onto? Family photos? Important documents? Money under the mattress? These would be good and logical choices. You would be wise to save all the valuables that you could for later.

However, when the Lord returns, we will not have time to grab anything, fix anything or change anything as it will all happen in the twinkling of an eye. (1 Corinthians 15:52). We will also not take anything with us (1 Timothy 6:7). In the past, we have said that we will take our record of life with us, but in reality, God holds those records. (Revelations 20:11-15; 2 Corinthians 5:10). So what is the point of this lesson? Be faithful every day. Be prepared to leave this world every day.
