DANA'S DIRECTION "How to have a successful Gospel Meeting"

Our Fall Meeting with David Newberry begins in just two weeks! For years I have been hearing that Gospel Meetings are no longer affective. Many congregations, in fact, have stopped having them at all. I will admit that it may take more work to have a successful gospel meeting than it once did. People are busier than ever, and the competition for their time is great. But, the fact remains that when the gospel is preached, souls will be saved. That is, of course, if we get them here! What is required of us? What can each of us do so that our meeting will help lead someone to Christ?

PURPOSE: A Gospel Meeting serves several purposes. All of us will benefit from the worship, fellowship, and Bible study. The primary goal of our meeting, however, is to evangelize. A meeting provides us with a convenient opportunity to invite our friends, neighbors, family members and others to hear a message that can save their soul! (Romans 1:16) It also makes it possible for us to do the work that the Lord would have us to do – and to bear fruit for Him.

PREPARATION: I know that Brother David has been looking forward for this opportunity for some time. His topics have been announced and his lessons are prepared. Now, what are we doing to prepare. In addition to inviting others (by sending cards, making phone calls, etc.) have you been praying for the success of this meeting?

PRESENCE: Have you cleared your calendar of anything that would hinder you from being here for every service? If all of us attend each night, and invite others, we can fill our building!

PARTICIPATION: It has been said, that you (our members) are the first sermon that people hear when they visit our services. Hopefully, we will all be gracious hosts. Arrive early so you can warmly greet all of our guests. Be prepared to answer questions and give assistance. Set the tone by entering into worship with enthusiasm. Sing! Use your Bible to follow the lesson. The first impression that people will have of the Camden Avenue Church of Christ will be the one they gain by observing us!

PRESENTATION: We have hearing a lot on the news lately about some of the common fare of many churches. We need to reassure people that when they come to our meeting, they will not hear about politics, social issues, or psychology. David is coming for one purpose – to preach Jesus Christ and Him crucified! (I Corinthians 2:2) We are not coming to be entertained – but to enter in to worship that is in Spirit and in truth. (John 4:24) Many of our guests will see for the first time how simple and significant New Testament worship really is.

PRAYER: Even after we have purposed, planned, prepared, are present and participate in our Gospel Meeting, we have not done all that we can do. We must put things into God's hands through prayer. We need to pray for success in our efforts to invite, for open hearts and minds of those who come, for the ability of our speaker to present the message, and for souls to be won.

Can you do the same for Him?


