DANA'S DIRECTION

"Deacons—Proven Men being Proven"

A well-known speaker in our brotherhood is famous for teasing deacons as part of his preaching. When asked why, he said it was because they are the most neglected people in the church, The expression "all dressed up and no place to go" comes to mind! It's true, in many churches, deacons are a tremendous resource that basically goes untapped. These men are well prepared, by the qualifications given in scripture, to serve the church in a very significant way. But often, they are not given the opportunity to use their abilities in a meaningful way. One man I knew had been a deacon for over ten years, His only "responsibility" for that entire time had been to keep song book racks in order.

"Deacons must be men of dignity, not double-tongued, or addicted to wine or fond of sordid gain, but holding the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience...let them be husbands of one wife and good managers of their children and their own households." (I Timothy 3:8-9, 12) Surely such men are qualified for greater service than they are often given!

Actually "deacon" is more of a description that it is a title. The Greek *diakonos*, means a servant, minister, waiter or attendant. When the church in Jerusalem found it difficult to keep up with the daily care of widows, men were selected to be over this ministry. (Acts 6:1-7) Serving is the highest calling in the church (Luke 22:24-26). The Apostles certainly were not above serving, but it wasn't expedient for them to leave their ministry (service) of prayer and the preaching of the word to serve tables. You want the right kind of men taking care of needs in the church. The apostles said "seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom." The end result of organizing the work of the church was positive. "The word of God spread, and the number of disciples multiplied greatly." (Acts 6:7)

This is no indication, however, that the role of deacons is limited to the physical work of the church. Two of these original seven, Stephen and Phillip, went on to distinguish themselves as evangelists in the mission field. In deacons, the church has a group of qualified men, ready and able to serve in most any capacity. They effectively work, not only caring for the physical needs of the church, but assist in all areas of the church's work. The only responsibility that the elders cannot delegate to them is accountability—the oversight of the church.

Serving as a deacon is a great way for a man to grow as a Christian leader. Some men will faithfully serve in this capacity for a lifetime—and we thank God for their faithfulness. But for some, becoming a deacon is the first step toward accepting even greater responsibilities in the church. A deacon must be a man of proven character before he is appointed. "Let them first be proved, then let them serve as deacons, being found blameless." (I Timothy 3:10) The way they handle the responsibilities given to them as deacons will prove whether they are qualified to be given more. "For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a good standing and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus." (I Timothy 3:13) Certainly, not all deacons become elders—but many elders (all of ours at Camden Avenue) begin their service to the church as deacons.

So, let's never take our deacons for granted! Paul said that we should "appreciate those who diligently labor among you." (I Thessalonians 5:12 NASV)


