

Deacons: Delegating the Lord's Work

Years ago a friend of mine became the manager of a small company. He was dedicated and very detail-oriented, and the company thrived under his leadership. The problem was that his hands-on style of leadership became more and more ineffective as the company grew. He recognized that he needed to put competent men in areas of authority and lead the company with their help. He was freed from the busy day-to-day tasks which enabled him to apply himself to planning and growing the company. He said "Delegation saved my career and made this company what it is". The same principle has always been applied to those leading God's people. In Exodus 18 we read where Moses made every decision regarding the Lord's people which meant that people stood before him every day from morning until evening. Moses' father-in-law, Jethro told him that this was not good. "Both you and these people who are with you will surely wear yourselves out. For this is too much for you; you are not able to perform it by yourself" (Exodus 18:17). Moses delegated. Men were chosen and trained. Moses retained the oversight, but the workload was shared by all.

In Acts 6, we find a similar situation occurred in the church at Jerusalem. The needs of the widows was being unattended. The Apostles said "It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables" (Acts 6:2). The church was instructed to select seven qualified men to set over this responsibility. The Apostles retained the oversight, but the workload was shared by all and the Apostles continued giving themselves to "prayer and the ministry of the word" (Acts 6:4).

By the time Paul wrote his letter to the Philippian church, the role of deacons was a recognized "office" in the church when he said "to all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, with the bishops and deacons" (Philippians 1:1). Qualifications for men serving in this role are recorded in I Timothy 3:8-13. Deacons are special servants of the church. Choosing men who have the qualifications given provide the elders and the church with a trustworthy and competent group of men who can be given special responsibilities in the congregation. The elders retain the oversight, but the workload is shared so the elders can apply themselves to the spiritual oversight of the church – shepherding the flock. The congregation at Camden Ave. has begun the process of selecting additional men to serve as deacons. This process will begin next Sunday as we all will have opportunity to submit names of those we consider qualified to serve. As we enter this process think of the following:

We must choose men who are qualified. Its not a matter of who one day might be this kind of a man – but who is. "But let these also first be proved; then let them serve as deacons" (I Timothy 3:10). Being a deacon is a growth in leadership role. "Let them use the office of a deacon." It is an opportunity to learn the work of the church from the inside. It is not a qualification for becoming an elder, but many times it is the way elders develop. It's not just working with the physical areas of work in the church. The qualifications include spiritual ones – the work of deacons does as well. Being a deacon provides a wonderful opportunity to grow as a Christian and as a leader. "Those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a good standing" (I Timothy3:13). Good deacons help elders be good elders. Good deacons help the church to grow. "And the word of God spread, and the number of disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem" (Acts 6:7)

When Jesus was taken before Caiaphas, as He walked the courtyard of the high priest, He had one of His loyal disciples follow Him at a distance. When this disciple was confronted about being one of Jesus' followers, he was confronted with a decision he had to make. It's time for Peter to say "I do" or "I don't" (Matthew 26:57-75).

Can you imagine how hard it was stand there to be sentenced to death because He claimed to be what He truly was, the Son of God? How hard it was to hear one of His close friends say "I do not know this man!"

How hard was it for Jesus to hear His people choose Barabbas over the one who would bring salvation to them? Christ went through the "Stick & Stones" only to hear the crucial words, "Crucify Him!"

Do you think maybe words are more powerful than sticks and stones...I thought you would. I encourage you to remember that what we say may either build people up or destroy them. Be an encourager, not a destroyer.
