THE WORDS OF JESUS

Words are extremely important. With words we convey our thoughts and ideas. Words are very powerful. Wars can be started or peace can prevail because of words. The Son of God used words to create, heal, teach, comfort, as well as to rebuke. Notice some passages of Scripture which speak of the Masters prominent, powerful, and potent words.

Jesus words are **AWESOME**. With words Jesus spoke the world and all the things into existence. At least nine times in the Genesis account of creation the words "and God said" appear. From the New Testament we learn that Jesus is the Creator and Sustainer of all life. "For by him (Jesus) were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth...all things were created by him, and for him: And he is before all things, and by him all things consist" (Colossians 1:16,17). Simply by saying "Peace, be still...even the wind and the sea" obeyed Jesus (Mark 4:39, 41). He upholds "all things by the power of His word" (Hebrews 1:3).

Jesus words are **ALL AUTHORITATIVE**. Jesus said to His disciples, "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth" (Matthew 28:18). That means Jesus has all authority. What He says goes! In all things He has the preeminence! (cf. Colossians 1:18). At the conclusion of the sermon on the mount, the Bible says, "When Jesus had ended these sayings, the people were astonished at this doctrine: For he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes" (Matthew 7:28-29). When temple officers were sent by the Chief Priests and Pharisees to arrest Jesus, they returned empty handed. When asked, "Why have ye not brought him?" their only defense was, "Never man spake like this man" (John 7:32, 45-46). Because Jesus has all authority, we must "hear him!" (Luke 9:35). In Hebrews 12:25 we read, "See that ye refuse not Him that speaketh," for if we refuse to hear Him, we will not escape!

Jesus words are **ABSOLUTE**. "Jesus said to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free...If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed" (John 8:31-32, 36). God has "committed all judgment unto the Son" (John 5:22) and it is the "words" of Jesus that shall judge us "in the last day" (John 12:48). The apostle Paul wrote, "For we must all appear before the judgement seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad. Knowing therefore the terror of the Lord, we persuade men" (2 Corinthians 5:10-11). In "the last day" when we shall all appear before Jesus in Judgement, we will either hear Him say "Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire," (Matthew 25:41) or, "Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you" (Matthew 25:34). His words will echo in our ears throughout eternity!

How will I be missed if I leave this congregation?

Many times, in a life of a congregation members of the congregation leave. There are many reasons why people leave a congregation, some are good reasons like a job opportunity or family situations, and some reasons are not so good maybe there is a disagreement, or someone feels they are not needed.

For whatever reason someone choses to leave a congregation there are somethings I would like to share with those who maybe considering leaving a congregation.

First, I wish I could tell them how much good is going on in the congregation. It is easy to look at the bad and wish the congregation could be doing more for the cause of Christ. Many times, this is true, the church should be doing more for the cause of Christ. But we must remember the good that is taking place, like the soul that was baptized and saved, the child that learned a new Bible truth, the missionary that is being supported by the congregation, and the so many other things that take place in the life of the congregation that is not always proclaimed from the pulpit or seen in the bulletin. This good which is being doing, is being done in part because you are here. Your support, money, kindness, and love for Christ is doing a great good!

Second, I wish I could tell them there may be other possibilities than leaving. It is true some situations will force someone to leave the congregation but not every situation. Many times, if a person would just come and talk to the elders or a minister, misunderstandings may be understood. Communication is key to any relationship and it is key for every member in the Body of Christ. Please talk to an elder or minister before you decide to leave the congregation.

Third, I wish I could tell them how much they are needed. Every member is important and essential to the life of the church. Romans 12:5, reminds, "so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another." Christian, you are needed in the body of Christ, to lose you would be like losing an arm or a leg. In fact, your even more important, without you the congregation cannot function as it should.

Fourth, I wish I could tell them every congregation has its problems. The New Testament mentions that some of the first congregations of the Lord's church had problems, Corinth, Thessalonica, and the Seven churches of Asia in Revelations 2 and 3, just to name a few. In this world we are going to have problems, and other congregations have problems too. Will you stay and help your home congregation before you move on to take on other problems? As the saying goes, "The grass is not greener on the other side of the fence, the grass is greener where you watered it."

Last, I wish I could tell them how much I love them. In Paul's letters in the New Testament we see him always sharing his love for his brothers and sisters in Christ. We sometimes just assume people know we love them; yet Paul never made that assumption. Notice, Philippians 4:1 "Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved." It may not be spoken but I do love you and the congregation here loves you.

Know this if you decided to leave this congregation you will be greatly missed, and I hope before you leave, you with think long and hard about how you will be missed. Think about it! Mark T. Tonkery
