Be Sincere....and Kind

In ancient Rome, sculpting was a popular profession. The market was flooded with sculptors, so quality was sometimes lacking. Less qualified and dishonest craftsmen would cover their errors with wax, and frequently the customer could not see the flaws. To compensate for this practice, authentic sculptors would mark their statues with the words *sine cera*, from two Latin words: *sine* (without) and *cera* (wax). Today, we frequently use the word to close letters: "sincerely."

As Christians we are to live authentic lives. We are the clay jar (Isaiah 64:8). The jar is flawed but does not want anyone to see the defects. Jesus cleanses us and transforms us into honorable jars (II Timothy 2:20-21). Jesus died on the cross for us (II Corinthians 5:21) to take away those defects/sins.

Many churches have become showcases for saints rather than hospitals for sinners. Let's live without wax. We have no reason to wax ourselves to impress others. We need to seek to "do nothing for selfish ambition or conceit" (Philippians 2:3) and love each other with a "sincere brotherly love" (I Peter 1:22). We are to live to serve and bring honor to Jesus. We need to be real so the love of Jesus can be seen clearly in each of us.

It is time we started giving God and others a life that is sine cera.

I appreciate elders who...

Elders who oversee the local congregation are an essential part of the organization of the local church. They are on the front lines of leading the local congregation and I appreciate them so much.

I appreciate elders who visit the sick. Jas. 5:14, states, "Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church...." One of the responsibilities of an elder is to pray and be concerned for the sick. One elder I knew not only visited members in the hospitals, but would get one's prescription, and run errands for members who were recuperating at home. This is an elder who knows how to take care of the sick.

I appreciate elders who lookout for their members. In Act 20:28, the Apostle Paul states, "Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood." Elders are charged with caring for the flock. One elder I was acquainted with found out that one of the single moms in the congregation child needed a very serious surgery. She needed to be in the hospital with her son and she needed to be at work. Her husband had left her and had no use for the child or her and she had not worked at the fast food restaurant long enough to get any time off. She was going to lose her job if she went to the hospital, but her son needed her. She was in quite the dilemma. One of the elders heard about her plight. He talked it over with this lady and then went to her manager. The manager would not work with the lady she was either to be at work or be fired. So, the elder, who was also a CEO of a company, asked if he could work the church member's shift while she went to the hospital. The manager said, "yes" but the elder would need trained. The elder was trained and worked for the church member for the next few weeks. He also gave the money he earned to this young mother. That is an elder who looks out for the members of the church.

I appreciate elders who are servants. Jesus said those who want to lead must be a servant (Mt. 20:25-28; Jn. 13:14-15). A servant is a person who has the go first attitude, as Jesus modeled in His life. Leaders do jobs that no one else is willing to do; like the one elder I was familiar with. One of the church members passed away and this elder went to visit the spouse. As often the case, family and friends had visited and left a pile of dishes in the sink. The elder made his visit and asked if there was anything he could do to help the man cope with the loss of his wife. The gentleman said there wasn't anything he could do so the elder had a prayer and started to leave. As the elder started to leave he noticed the dishes, and without thinking about it he went over and began to wash dishes. That is an elder that is a servant.

I appreciate elders who check in with their members. 1 Pe. 5:2, states, "shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly..." The Lord has instructed the elders to shepherd the congregation, this means to care for and look after the congregation. One elder I knew would call each member every month to "check in" with them. He called them regardless if they missed Sunday worship or not. This was his way of shepherding the flock, he wanted them to know that he truly cared for the congregation and to help each member with any need they may have had. That is an elder who knows how to shepherd the flock.

I could share other examples such as the elders who every Friday would go with their preacher to have Bible study and visit the local nursing home. The elders who would go to their members' weddings, funerals, and sporting events. The elders who teach the gospel, counsel their members, and lead by example in every area of their life. I appreciate elders because this is God's plan (I Timothy 3:1-7/Titus 1:5-9). Not only is this God's plan, but elders like this will help lead a congregation to Heaven. Think about it! Mark T.
