YOU PREACH FIRST!

The first sermon preached each Sunday is not by the minister, but by you.

You preach a message of good cheer when you say "Good morning!" to those you meet when you park your car and when you are in the hallway before the services.

You preach the message of "Welcome! We have room for you!" when you slide over in the pew instead of forcing others to squeeze in front of you.

You preach a message of hope and joy when you sing enthusiastically during the song service.

You preach a message about the power of prayer when you fervently enter into our time of prayer together.

You preach a message of respect when you listen attentively while the preacher is speaking.

You preach a message of love when you smile, say hello, and introduce yourself to visitors. When brethren embrace and show concern for each other, one hears the words of Jesus: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are My Disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35).

You preach a message about faith when you give your offering.

You preach a message about the importance of the Scriptures when you bring your Bible.

Many messages are preached before the minister stands up to bring his message.

If your message is positive and consistent, then the message given from the pulpit will be much better received.

Come prepared each Sunday to preach a sermon by the example you set.

People will judge the church by how we live even more stringently than by the message the preacher preaches.

This is why Paul told Timothy, "Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but *rather* in speech, conduct, love, faith *and* purity, show yourself an example of those who believe" (1 Timothy 4:12, emp, added).

Your life is the book people will read even when they do not read the Bible.

What is the gospel according to you? How do people read your text? They will believe what they see much quicker than they will believe what they hear. Does your life match what you believe?


