BROTHERLY KINDNESS

When I think of brotherly kindness I think of Jesus Christ. If the truth were known, his acts of kindness would be numberless. But the Scriptures do attempt to give us a picture of this virtue on the life of our Lord. Brotherly kindness was shown when Jesus fed the hungry multitudes; when he healed the lame and blind; when he showed compassion in raising the son of the widow of Nain from the dead; when he cried at the tomb of Lazarus.

As great as these acts of kindness were, his greatest act was the sharing of his saving message to the world which he made possible by dying at Calvary. Without that one act of kindness, we would still be lost in sin.

It goes without saying that we should always demonstrate this virtue in our lives. Most of us can be kind as long as things go smoothly. It's when we're tested that we know whether or not we have the virtue.


If you truly have brotherly kindness you:

- 1. Will not respond negatively to another's offenses, but you will turn the other cheek.
- 2. Will not take revenge into your own hands because it belongs to God.
- 3. Will not spread damaging gossip about others whether it is true or not!
- 4. Will not hold grudges, but will forgive and forget.
- 5. Will give your brother the benefit of the doubt.

As Paul put it, showing brotherly kindness is "bearing with one another, and forgiving each other . . . Just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you" (Colossians 3:13).

Monday Night for the Master begins March 19

There are many good works the church can do to help God's Kingdom to grow and be vibrant. One of those works that our elders have chosen for the congregation to participate in is Monday Night for The Master (MNTFM). This is a major congregational evangelistic program designed for <u>every member</u> here at the Camden Ave. Church of Christ.

One of the reasons I love MNFTM is because it puts Romans 12:4-5 into practice, notice what it states, "For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another."

MNFTM gives each member the opportunity to exercise their "function" and help the congregation to be the church it needs to be. This effort is aimed to help those in our community who are non-members and those who are members of the congregation.

MNFTM begins at the building with a meal at 5:45 p.m. for all workers and their children. The "work" begins around 6:30 p.m. after a brief devotional and prayer. Workers will work for an hour to two hours depending on their job assignments.

We will start MNFTM March 19. (MNFTM will continue the following Monday evenings: April 2, April 16, April 30, and May 14).

This spring at each MNFTM we will offer six teams. Each member is asked to sign up to participate in one of the teams that interests them. This will help in the planning of the work that can be done each evening.

The teams are as follows:

The visitation team – This team will visit those who are sick, shut-ins, new members, and visitors to our worship services.

The encouragement team - This team will send greeting cards to those who are homebound, those who need encouragement, visitors to our services, birthdays, and anniversaries.

The maintenance team – This team will work on the physical aspect of the church building.

The Bible correspondence courses team - This team is for those who would like to work to organize the Bible correspondence room and prepare and send Bible correspondence courses.

Bible school teachers team - All Bible school teachers are welcome to come to work in their classrooms, prepare Bible lessons, contact their students, and work in the teacher supply room. Paul Inman will be available in the Teacher supply room to help with any of the teacher's needs.

Youth team - All youth are invited to come as well to work on small service projects around the church building or help other teams.

Everyone who attends will also need to sign-up to bring items for the meal.

Why Are You Afraid?

When Jesus and the disciples were caught in a storm on Galilee, they woke Him up, and He calmed the storm. He then said to them; "Why are you afraid? How is it that you have no faith?" (Mark 4:40).

The word for fear here is "deilos" - dread; timid; fearful, or cowardice (Never used in a good sense.) Fear of God is "phobas" - originally "flight." Sometimes we run into the storms of life and we react with "dread," which perhaps tells God we are lacking in faith.

He understands normal fear, but wants us to hold on to faith. God does not want us to be paralyzed with fear. He wants us to remember our faith when we run into problems.

May God help us to grow in faith.
