DANA'S DIRECTION

"Live for Jesus"

In II Corinthians 5:14-15, Paul writes "For the love of Christ constrains us...He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again."

We often sing the familiar hymn "Live for Jesus." The motivation for doing so is the sacrifice that He made so that we might be saved. Presenting our bodies as living sacrifices is our "reasonable service." (Romans 12:1) Because Jesus died for me, I should die to self and live for Him. Paul summarized "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me." (Galatians 2:20) "Live for Jesus." What does it mean?

First, to live for Jesus, we must truly be His disciple; one who follows Him, learns from Him, and obeys Him. Jesus said, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciple indeed." (John 8:31) Over the past few years the expression WWJD ("What would Jesus do?") has been popular. The sentiment is good, but what exactly does that mean? The proper question is "What has Jesus told me to do?" To follow Jesus is to follow His word.

Second, to live for Jesus we must be available to Him. Following Jesus indicates leaving other things behind. When Jesus called them, Peter, James and John dropped their fishing nets where they were and followed. We certainly must continue to meet our obligations to our families and society, but we must be willing to sacrifice less important matters in order to be about our Father's business. We think nothing about setting apart an evening a week for bowling, or a Saturday afternoon to wash the cars and mow the lawn - what part of the week do we set apart to work for Jesus? "By this My father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples." (John 15:8)

Third, to live for Jesus we must follow His example - and walk in His steps. (I Peter 2:21) The scriptures say of Jesus "He went about doing good." He showed humility toward God by saying "Not My will but Your will be done." He showed humility toward man, by being the servant of men. How do we follow Jesus? If I then...have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done unto you." (John 13:14-15) We live for Jesus by doing His work, by caring for the needs of men, and sharing with them the gospel of Christ.

"Live for Jesus, O my brother, His disciple ever be; render not to any other what alone the Lord's should be. Live for Jesus, live for Jesus! Give Him all thou hast to give; on the cross the world's redeemer; Gave His life that thou mightst live."

Enslaved

During the fourteenth century Raynald III, was a duke in what is now Belgium. As the result of a violent quarrel, Raynald's younger brother Edward successfully revolted against him. When Edward captured Raynald he built a room around him featuring windows and a door and promised him that the day he left the room his title and property would be returned to him.

The problem with this arrangement was that Raynald was grossly overweight and could not fit through the openings in the room. Raynald needed to lose weight before he could leave the room. Edward knew that his older brother could not control his appetite and sent him delicious food every day. As you may imagine, Raynald grew fatter during this time.

Anytime someone accused Duke Edward of treating Raynald cruelly he said: "My brother is not a prisoner. He may leave when he so wills."

Raynald stayed in that room for ten years and wasn't released until after Edward died in battle. By then his health was so ruined he died within a year. He was a prisoner of his own appetite. (Source: *The Three Edwards*, Thomas B. Costain)

Just as Raynald was enslaved by his appetite, sin will enslave all those who yield to it. Rom. 6:16-18, explains it this way, "Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness."

Jesus died on the cross so that we, might be set free from of our sins. He "bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness; by whose stripes you were healed" (1 Peter 2:24). In order to have our sins forgiven and the burden of guilt lifted from our lives, we must believe in Him (Acts 16:31), repent of our sins (Acts 17:30), and be baptized so that our sins can be washed away (Acts 2:38; 22:16). Then, as we continue to walk in the light as He is in the light, the blood of Jesus continues to cleanse us from all sin (1 John 1:7).

Minute of Meditation by Mark T. Tonkery Heard on 91.0 AM WLTP

A husband and wife were driving in a car, the wife tells her husband to turn right at the next light and by mistake, he turns left. When he realizes what he has done, he says to his wife "I'm sorry dear, I went the wrong way." But if that is all he does, it isn't enough. His saying sorry isn't getting them any closer to where they want to be; he needs to stop the car, turn it around and go back to the correct road. That is repentance.



Repentance is a word that comes from a culture where people were nomadic and lived in a world with no maps or street signs. It's easy to get lost walking through the desert. You finally say to yourself, I'm going in the wrong direction and turn around.

A person who is not following Christ is in the wrong direction spiritually. They need to stop and turn around.

The Bible puts it this way, "For godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation without regret..." (2 Corinthians 7:10).
