Why I Preach?

While I was at Ohio Valley College one my professors asked our class of preaching students to write a bulletin article on, "Why We Preach?" Since then I have continued to ask that question and have used it to evaluate my reason for preaching for over 20 years.

Now that I am transitioning to preaching regularly again, I have asked myself, "Why do I preach?"

First, while growing up our family always went to worship and Bible class. I enjoyed studying and learning about the Bible. Then when I was about twelve years old a Bible class teacher, told me she thought I should be a preacher. Although I enjoyed studying the Bible, I never thought of myself as ever being a preacher, especially at twelve years old, from that time on I fought the notion that I would ever be a preacher. Although I continued to be interested in the things of the Bible and continued go to Bible class, worship, and would read my Bible regularly, preaching was not the plan I had for my life.

Then when I was about thirteen years old I was baptized into Christ and continued to grow in faith. When I was fourteen years old I was asked by one of our elders to teach the Wednesday night second - sixth grade Bible class; I learned I enjoy teaching the Bible. Then when I went to college my interest and love for the Lord continue to grow. I would often have Bible studies with other students and tried sharing the gospel of Christ with those who were lost.

It was while in college that I realized my heart's desire was to make it my life's mission to preach the Gospel of Jesus. Although I am an imperfect person, just like everyone else. I felt like Jeremiah in Jeremiah 20, I just could not keep the message of God to myself.

Luke 19:10 tells us that Jesus Christ came to this world to seek and save the lost. Jesus then gives each one of us this mission in Matthew 28:19-20, where He states, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."

I preach because I want to obey Jesus' words in Matthew 28:19-20 and put them into practice. I want to be able to show people that our God is a loving and caring God. God's love was demonstrated by Jesus; by Him dying on the cross and being resurrected from the grave He took care of our sin problem and made a way for people to go to Heaven.

God has designed a wonderful plan for each one of us, so that we may be able to live the best way possible in this life and help prepare us for eternity. I preach because I want to be able to share God's wonderful plan with other and if I do not who will?
