It is just fornication

As our society grows more secular, its' influence is seen even more in the church. One such example is that of fornication or sexual immorality. Fornication comes from the Greek word "Porneia" it is where we get our word for "pornography" and can mean any sexual sin outside of the marriage relationship of one man and one woman for life. It can include but not limited to pre-marital sexual relations, incest, adultery, prostitution, homosexuality, bestiality, polygamy, lust, and other sexual sins.

I once had an unfaithful member of the church who was having a sexual affair with another member of the church tell me, "well it is just sex," as if they were just holding hands or they just gave each other a hug. This unfaithful brother is not alone in his thinking, many Christians, are being influenced by the world and thinking there really is nothing wrong with fornication.

If there is nothing wrong with fornication, then why does the Bible list it with other sins such as in Rom. 1:26-32, Gal. 5:19-21, Col. 3:5-10, Rev. 21:8; 22:15? Notice fornication's association with other sins tells something about its unrighteousness. Then Mat. 5:32 and Mat. 19:9 tells about its destructiveness, that this sin alone is the cause of divorce in a marriage relationship. 1 Cor. 7:2 teaches that because of the evils of fornication in society a man and woman should marry to help protect and provide self-control from it. Then look through the Old Testament, sexual immorality contributed to the cause of the flood (Gen. 6:2); the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah (Jude 1:7); And then in Num. 25 what Balaam, the false prophet, could not do with his curses on Israel, sexual immorality and the worship of idols did do, and that is sin against the Lord.

Then look at Samson, King David, King Solomon, Abraham, Gomer, the man in 1 Cor. 5 and the woman in John 8 all these were caught in adultery and had negative results in their life. Even if we understand that some of them received forgiveness for their indiscretion they still had consequences for their sins for the rest of their life.

Then there are these direct commands from scripture: Eph. 5:3, states, "But sexual immorality and all impurity or covetousness must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints." Col. 3:5, teaches, "Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. And 1 Th. 4:3, declares, "For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from sexual immorality."

Then there is the "wisdom from the streets" as Pro. 1:21 puts it; that wisdom that we can see and witness. Such is the case with fornication or sexual immorality there is the possibility of an unwanted child, contracting a disease, the relational problems, depression, and stress that can come with living this type of lifestyle.

Then the most powerful teaching of the Bible is that if one continues to commit sexual immorality they will not inherit the kingdom of God (1Cor. 6:9,10; Gal. 5:19-21). Heb 13:4 even states, "Let marriage be held in honor among all, and let the marriage bed be undefiled, for God will judge the sexually immoral and adulterous."

Knowing this, how can anyone say, "it is just fornication or sex?" It is sin. It is the way to great problems here on earth and it is the way of eternal death.

The good news is we do not have to live this type of lifestyle. The Bible teaches us, we can repent and change our spiritual directions. Acts 3:19, reminds us, "Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out." Think about it!

WHAT WE OWE OUR MINISTER

- I. Our minister is a messenger of God, to teach us the better way of life. As a faithful servant, let us respect him, hold him in honor, listen to his message. When we honor him, we honor God; when we dishonor him, we dishonor God. (Matthew 10:40).
- II. Our minister is a member of God's family. This means that he is our brother, Let us, therefore, rejoice with him, suffer with him, pray with him, pray for him. God forbid that we should make his burden more heavy, his task more difficult.
- III. Our minister is a human being, a man of like passions and infirmities. It overtaken in a trespass, we should not crush him but restore him. (Galatians 6:1,2). Our Master restored an erring preacher and sent him forth. (John 21:15-17; Acts 2:14ff).
- IV. Our minister is a fellow-citizen in the kingdom. This means that he, like ourselves, should regulate his conduct by the King's law. All should subject themselves to the same standard. We should expect no more or no less of him than we expect of ourselves. Our King is not the author of a double-standard.
- V. Our minister is a laborer in the vineyard; therefore worthy of his hire. (Matthew 10:10; Luke 10:7). He is a gospel preacher, therefore he should live of the gospel. (1 Corinthians 9:14). His support should be adequate.
- VI. Our minister is a neighbor. Therefore, we should love him as we love ourselves. (Matthew 7:12;22;39). Loving him thus, we will do him no injury; we will bless him.
- VII. Our minister is a public man. He is "on the spot." He stands on the line of battle. He fights sin. In fighting sin, he may incur the anger of the sinner. The sinner may seek to do him injury. From all unjust attacks, we should faithfully shield him. (1 Timothy 5:19).
- VIII. The duty of our minister is to study, to teach, to preach. To the end that he may be effective in his assigned task, let us not load him down with minor matters. Let us not ask him to serve tables, to wrestle with financial problems, to spend his time going from house to house. It is his duty to visit unfortunate people, not because he is a minister, but because he is a Christian. Let there be no confusion of his duties. "Let the preacher preach." F.L.C.
