

What will we remember most about 2018?

It is hard to believe, but there is less than two days left in 2018. As we close out this year, I wonder what we will remember most about this year. I guess only time will tell but if your memory is like mine I tend to forget more than I remember. I can remember all sorts of facts from years ago, but some days I can't remember where I put my glasses or laid my keys.

Memory is a funny thing. Sometimes we go into a room to get something and when we get there we can't remember what we are looking for. We can remember things that are absolutely useless, and then can't remember things we need. Memories can be frustrating but also amusing.

There was a couple who was getting ready to go on vacation. As they were checking their many bags at the airport, the husband remarked to his wife, "I wish we would have brought the radio." The wife responded, "Why? We already have half a dozen bags." "I know," replied the husband, "but our plane tickets were on the radio."

I read of another person who had problems with memory. The story went something like this: There was a farmer who had his cousin visiting him out in the country. Now his cousin was a city raised boy visiting the country for the first time. This farmer had a sheep dog that could do all sorts of things and he showed him to his cousin. The dog rounded up the animals and could even latch and unlatch the gate. Well, the city raised cousin was amazed and said, "Wow! That's a great dog! What's his name?" The farmer scratched his head and thought for a moment. "Let's see—his name—there's this flower everyone likes—red—what is that?" "Rose." The farmer turns to his wife, "Rose, what's that dog's name?"

Forgetfulness. I heard someone call this "part timer's disease" where you can only remember part of the information part of the time. Now it really isn't a big deal until we forget the important things like a birthday or anniversary or an appointment—but even then these are not that big of a deal compared to some of the things God asks us to remember in His Word.

The Bible teaches us that we are to remember our Creator in the days of our youth (Ecc. 12:1), we are to remember the great acts of God (Deut. 15:15), we are to remember the commands of scripture (2 Peter 3:2), and we are to remember Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection (2 Tim. 2:8). I don't know what you and I will remember most about 2018 but the most important things we must remember are the things God commands us to remember in His book, the Bible. Think about it!

I Appreciate Appreciation

There is a battle that rages in homes all across America. The child gets something (maybe a piece of candy) and says nothing. Dad or mom tells the child: "say thank-you." Through shyness or stubbornness the kid refuses. Maybe they are told again: "say thank-you." A little head shakes no. At this point the determined parent tells the kid: "you've got two choices. Say thank-you or give the candy back." And then usually at that point there is at least a mumbled "thank-you." I get that this battle can be tedious but it is certainly worth fighting. Parents give their children a tremendous blessing when they train them to be appreciative of the things they receive. Our Heavenly Father encourages the same attitude: "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18).

But what if we don't learn to be appreciative? What if we were given pieces of candy as a kid but didn't learn that we should be grateful for the gift? Well, I suspect we would have a different kind of mindset at that point. I might think that I was given that candy because I was just so cute. (I was cute at one point, ask my mom). I might come to think it was the other person's Christianly duty to give me candy. And if that happens I might come to expect the candy, perhaps even becoming upset when a good Christian person walks by and doesn't give me candy. And that, my friends, would be no fun to be around. It sucks all the joy out of giving when the person you're trying to bless expects you to do it.

Let me make a suggestion. Be thankful. Even if you didn't learn the practice early train yourself to be super appreciative whenever someone does something for you. Especially be in the habit of praising God. "Praise him – he is your God, had you have seen with your own eyes the great and astounding things that he has done for you" (Deuteronomy 10:21). Many people are MUCH more vocal about the things they don't have, or the things that are going wrong. But I think God delights in those who spend more time in praise for all the many blessings they do have. Wouldn't you?
