

<u>Our Money Talks</u>

The Encourager, the bulletin of Calvert City Church of Christ, edited by Terry Casey shared the following:

In Sunday's edition of the San Antonio News was an interesting item. A wealthy business man is being sued by his wife for a divorce. According to a court affidavit the wife is demanding almost \$28,000 per month as a settlement. The breakdown of projected monthly expenditures was reported as follows:

Clothing	\$6,452.00
Restaurants	\$2,600.00
Gifts	\$2,267.00
Groceries	\$1,592.00
Beauty Parlor	\$1,440.00
Miscellaneous	\$1,407.00
Furnishings	\$1,255.00
Pet Care	\$171.00
Church Charities	\$20.00

WOW! Her demands for one month are as much or more than many folks make in a year. But what stands out even more is the last figure ("church charities") as compared to the other items. It is evident where her priorities are.

This story reminded me of another story: An old dollar bill and an even older \$20 arrive at a Federal Reserve Bank to be retired. "I've had a pretty good life," the \$20 says. "I've been to Vegas, the finest restaurants in New York, and even on a Caribbean cruise." "You did have an exciting life!" the dollar says. "Where have you been?" the \$20 asks. "Oh, I've gone from church to church throughout my life. "Wait," the \$20 interrupts. "What's a church?"

Money talks? Maybe not verbally but If someone was to look at our checkbook it would tell what we value, what we think is important and speaks about where we spend our money.

What does our checkbook say about our relationship with God? 2 Cor. 9:6-7, reminds, "... whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Then 1 Cor. 16:2 teaches, "On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper...."

No matter how much we give we must give with a cheerful heart, a pure heart, and a spirit of sacrifice. Acts 20:35 tells us it is more blessed to give than receive. As we give of our money this morning, what will our money say about our loyalty to the Lord?

Energizer made a very clever move when they came up with the bunny who wouldn't quit. That bunny has been drumming since 1988. Yes please – I want my battery powered devices to last thirty years. I think Energizer came up with some effective advertising by tapping into our respect for things that persevere. All the other toys around that bunny have long given up, but he just keeps going and going and so on and so forth.

We respect that. We respect those who refuse to quit. This is a quality that God likes as well: "And as for you, brothers and sisters, never tire of doing what is good" (2 Thessalonians 3:13). You are called to just keep serving and loving and serving and loving . . . Of course, we probably don't always want to keep serving. The devil is always trying to discourage us from loving actions to varying degrees of success. His goal is to get us to think that all of our efforts are not worth it, that they won't amount to anything. He wants us to think that the people we serve will disappoint us and that our relationships are doomed to fall apart. If he is succeeding in your life I would like to direct your heart and mind to the love of God.

Has God ever quit on you? Has He, not day after day, reached out to you and encouraged you to be near Him? Of course, He has, for God is love. And love "always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres" (1 Corinthians 13:7).

When you see a fighter who takes punch after punch and just keeps going you probably respect him for it. When you see a bullied kid courageously keep walking to school day after day you may cheer him on. And you should! But also cheer for the "friend who sticks closer than a brother" (Proverbs 18:24). There are a lot of ways a friendship can fall apart – but the ones you really want to have are the ones who just will not give up on you. That is godly love. Respect the marriage that lasts fifty years. There are a number of ways that a marriage can fall apart, but give credit to the man who is faithful to the "wife of his youth" (Malachi 2:14). This is godly love – a love that always protects, always trusts. always hopes, and always perseveres.

Royce Clay tells the story about an experience he once had. While he was waiting at a bus stop, an elderly lady got off the bus and walked slowly over to where he stood.


