A Holiday For Atheists

Henry Morris, in his book *The Heavens Declare The Glory Of God*, says, "...April 1 would be a good holiday for atheists..." (93). The Bible says, "The fool has said in his heart, 'There is no God'" (Psalm 14:1; 53:1). *Fool* (nabal) means, "stupid" (Morris 93). Paul stated that those who do not "like to retain God in their knowledge" (Romans 1:28) are futile in their thoughts (Romans 1:21). *Futile* here means, "unintelligent, without insight" (Rogers 317). Often it is the case that atheists boast of their philosophy as being "intellectual" and "scientific." However, the Bible labels anti-God philosophy as foolish (cf. Romans 1:21). The Bible identifies all who reject the evidence for God (cf. Romans 1:20-21) as "professing to be wise," but in actuality, they have become fools (Romans 1:22). The word fools comes from the word from which we get the word moron.

- G.K. Chesterton once remarked, "If people stop believing in religion they don't then believe in nothing, they believe in everything" (qtd. In Pepper 49). What are some of the foolish (i.e. unintelligent, moronic) beliefs of an atheist?
 - 1. Life came from that which was not living. Even though all the available evidence today implies that life only comes from life, an atheist believes that, at sometime in the past, the living came from the non-living.
 - 2. There can be design without a designer. A watch implies a watchmaker. A shoe implies a shoemaker. A house implies a house builder. An atheist believes the watchmaker, shoemaker, and house builder do not have a maker (cf. Hebrews 3:4).
 - 3. **The human body just happened**. An atheist believes the circulatory, respiratory, digestive, reproductive, etc. systems in man just happened (cf. Psalm 139:14).
 - 4. There is no hereafter-no heaven or hell. An atheist believes physical death is the end. According to the atheist, our total being goes to the dust. There will be no accounting no matter how one lives (cf. Acts17:31).
 - 5. **The Bible is a book of colossal lies**. If God does not exist, then the Bible is not the Word of God as it claims (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16-17).
 - 6. **Jesus Christ was a liar or a lunatic**. If God does not exist, then Jesus is not the Son of God as He claimed. Instead, He would be the biggest charlatan, fraud or fakes known to man (cf. 1 Peter 1:12).

Perhaps Morris is correct. April Fool's Day would be a good holiday for the atheists. Only a fool could believe there is no God.

THE POWER OF A FRIENDLY VISIT

There is power in a friendly visit. I heard a true story about a group of ladies who went to the home of a delinquent lady member and announced that they had come to stay until she decided to come back to services. I do not know how long they stayed, but the visit was a success. The delinquent member came back into fellowship with the congregation.

I heard another story of a delinquent church member who was visited each day by different members of the church until the unfaithful one was restored and active in the faith again.

Never underestimate the power of just showing that we care with a friendly visit. James 1:27 teaches us, "External religious worship [religion as it is expressed in outward acts] that is pure and unblemished in the sight of God the Father is this: to visit *and* help and care for the orphans and widows in their affliction *and* need, and to keep oneself unspotted *and* uncontaminated from the world" (Amplified Version).

When Christians visit the homebound, the delinquent, the sick, and others who need to be contacted several things take place:

First, we are keeping the holy commands of God as instructed in James 1:27. Second, those we visit will know that we and the church really care for them. Third, we will provide a blessing to those we visit as well as for us. I have often received more joy from visiting people than what I tried to provide for them. Fourth, it will build spirituality. Anytime when you focus on doing things for God you only come closer to Him and encourage others' faith as well. Last, it will give encouragement. It is so easy to get discouraged, but when two people come together in mutual love for the Lord it will only encourage those involved.

Flavil Yeakley, stated this when he talks about the power of a visit, "When a person has no meaningful personal contact with the congregation in the process of his conversion, he is likely to feel no meaningful sense of identification with his congregations after conversion and therefore likely to drop out."

"Like moths, people gravitate to light and warmth." We can be that light and warmth to someone who is experiencing darkness and the coldness of the world. We can be that person who helps other members stay faithful to the Lord and help them get to Heaven.

Tomorrow Night, April 1 come to Monday Night for the Master and let's provide some encouragement to one another. There are activities for everyone, there will be visits to be made, cards to send, classrooms to attend to, and housekeeping around the building. DOUG'S DISCUSSION



Set Apart

In Old Testament times there was an optional vow that a man or woman could make to the Lord. This vow would make you different from others, in fact the Bible calls it "a vow of separation" (Numbers 6:2). After making this vow you would eat different, drink different, mourn in a different way, and since you weren't allowed to cut your hair during this vow you would look different too. After becoming a Nazarite (the name of the vow), it would be fairly obvious to those around you what you have done. It would be clear that you have been set apart for God.

Christian people should ask themselves if that is just as clear about us. Is it obvious that we are set apart? Do we eat differently, talk differently, dress differently, and act differently from the people around us? Is this the kind of life that we present as an offering to God? Well, maybe not. The truth is that this kind of life comes at a real cost. Everyone who has ever attended high school knows the consequences of being different from your peers. If you don't act like, look like and sound like the others there's a target on your back. Is that a price you are willing to pay to be set apart for God? David's passion for God once lead him to say, "For I endure scorn for you sake, and shame covers my face. I am a stranger to my brothers, an alien to my own mother's sons; for zeal for your house consumes me, and the insults of those who insult you fall on me" (Psalm 69:7-9).

Later the phrase "zeal for your house consumes me" would be replied to Jesus. His passion for God was so great that He honored God over the crowd. As we know, this choice would eventually cost Jesus his life, a life He freely gave for the glory of God. If we are going to follow in Jesus' steps we will have to be willing to be different. We have to be willing to praise God with all our hearts even if that gets us funny looks. We have to be willing to say the Words of God even when there are some who don't want to hear it. We have to be willing to share the gospel with our family and friends even though we may lose these relationships because of it. I know that's not what most people do but you're not most people. Like the Nazarite of old you are set apart.
