Dare not to be a Diotrephes

The church today faces many problems in a similar way as the first century church did. For example, the apostle John refers to a man named Diotrephes in 3 Jn. 1:9, "I have written something to the church, but Diotrephes, who likes to put himself first, does not acknowledge our authority." Notice, the Bible says that he "likes to be first." Diotrephes was a church "boss" who ruled the church to suit his own whims.

A. T. Robertson once wrote an article for a religious magazine. He described the conduct of the biblical Diotrephes. Twenty-five deacons from various churches wrote to the editor, canceling their subscriptions. They contended that Robertson was writing about them.

Even today there are those individuals who like to take control of God's people, "to be first," and usurp the authority of the elders and even God. This is the seed of division. Division often happens when people hunger for power and control. They want things done their way, and if they do not get it, they start doing things on their own.

John calls out Diotrephes for this type of behavior, but he is not the only one who was causing division in the first century church, 1 Cor. 1:10-13 we see that there was a whole congregation divided by following different preachers and some were even using Christ's name as a way to divide. It is a reminder that sometimes we can do the right things for the wrong reasons.

Paul will go on to say in Titus 3:10-11, "As for a person who stirs up division, after warning him once and then twice, have nothing more to do with him, knowing that such a person is warped and sinful; he is self-condemned." And then in Galatians 5:19-21 tells us that a person who causes division and dissensions will not inherit the kingdom of God. Then Jude 1:19, states, "It is these who cause divisions, worldly people, devoid of the Spirit."

The scriptures are very serious when it comes to those who create division and dissension within a congregation; they are to be warned or corrected and if they continue to cause dissension the church is to have nothing to do with them. Notice the Bible also tells us that these people are "devoid of the Spirit" and "will not inherit the kingdom of God."

Not only is the attitude of Diotrephes not good for an individual spiritually; they also harm the influence of the church. Jesus points out in Matthew 12:25, "...Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and no city or house divided against itself will stand." May we learn from the teaching and wisdom of Jesus Christ, no local congregation can withstand division; it has no place in the Lord's church.

It has been said that the man who holds the ladder at the bottom is about as important as the man at the top. If the man at the top is wise, he will recognize the importance of the man at the bottom.

Christians are not islands unto themselves. We need each other. Each member must care about all the other members of the church. Everyone achieves more when we work together. We must work together for the accomplishing of God's will; His will is too big for anyone one of us to do it alone.

Dare not to be a Diotrephes, for those who do, it will be their downfall. Think about it!

DOUG'S DISCUSSION



What If?

Historians sometimes have a little fun considering the "what if?" question. What would the world be like if the South had won the civil war? What if Julius Caesar was never assassinated? What if Germany was victorious in WW2? I don't think it takes too much imagination to grasp that there are certain moments that could have gone very differently, and if they did the world might not even be recognizable to us today. I don't think I'd be very excited to live in a world where Hitler created a dynasty and the sort of evil he encouraged remained unchecked.

I also would not be excited about living in a world without Jesus. Let me ask you this – what if Jesus never came to earth to die for our sins? What if He took one look at us in heaven and decided we weren't worth it? What if He did call those ten thousand angels to rescue him from the cross? If Jesus never rescues us then we would live in a world without hope. With no empty tomb what evidence would we have that death isn't the end? Without the blood of Jesus that "purifies us from all sin" (1 John 1:7) What hope would we have of pleasing God? Without pleasing God how could we get to heaven?

Let us all praise God for Jesus! There are many other ways God could have dealt with a stubborn, sinful people. But out of all possibilities God chose love. He chose to pay the ultimate price so that He could be with us forever. I would have no words of comfort and hope for you if we served a god who is less generous, less forgiving. But we don't. We serve our God! "The Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love. The Lord is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made" (Psalm 145:8-9). Instead of taking God's abundant grace for granted we need to understand what our situation would be if God DIDN'T send Jesus. Consider "What If?" and then praise God all the more.


