Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery



There is a T-shirt that I once saw that read, "Jesus is Coming, Quick, Look Busy". It reminds me of a time when I was in Junior High and when my mother would leave the house to go to the neighbor's house. She would leave my sister and I home alone with a list of work to do around the house. My sister and I would often "goof off" until we would hear her car pull into the driveway and we would start working on our chores. Observably we did not fool our mother into believing we had worked the whole time she was away.

This is often a problem that many managers and supervisors have today, lazy employees who only look busy when they are present. Colossians 3:22 has something to say about this when it states, "Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord." Paul is trying to teach Christians that even if they are a bondservant or in today's understanding an employee, that they should do their job well, not to please an earthly master but to please their Lord. Notice, Colossians 3:23-24, "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ."

Paul reminds us that the Lord is not an absentee manager as the T-shirt insinuates. No one can fool God into believing that we are busy doing His will when His Son returns.

Furthermore, Jesus tells us in Matthew 24:36, "But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only." Because no one knows the day or hour Jesus will return we each must prepare for that day.

We can be prepared for Jesus' second coming by accepting His offer of salvation and receiving His gift of eternal life by placing our faith and trust in Him (Mark 16:16), turning from our sins in repentance (Acts 17:30-31), confessing Jesus before men (Matthew 10:32), and being baptized (immersed) into Christ for the forgiveness of our sins (Acts 2:38). When we do so, the blood of Jesus washes away our sins (Acts 22:16).

Jesus goes on to explain in Matthew 25 that the way the Christian is to continue to be prepared for Christ's return is being watchful, using our talents, and being caring, helpful, and benevolent to one another.

Jesus is coming back, but we are not to pretend, or just look busy, but we are to be watchful and faithfully doing His will. How will Jesus find you when He returns?

Deeds Make a Difference

I personally believe that we will never fully know the impact that we had on others in this life. When we give a smile, a kind word, or a piece of advice we might not think much of it – but to someone else it might make all the difference. I look forward to the day when I can truly see how much serving God mattered. "Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known" (1 Corinthians 13:8).

One of our graduates told me about how helpful it was to have a Christian friend to sit with during High School lunch. Today's High School environment can be tough on young Christians. The act of eating lunch with a younger friend from church probably didn't seem like a big deal – but it was the high point of someone's day. Little did Madison Taberner know that when she waved her fellow Christian over to her lunch table she was doing something that would support someone's faith. Later she will know fully, on the day she receives her reward.

Are you being the person that Jesus called you to be? He says, "let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16). Everything we do matters. Every word we say matters. Our character and attitudes can lead to God being praised or they can lead people away from the One who made them.

Do you remember that time when you were explaining something from the Bible to someone in grade school? Remember how you had to explain it in about six different ways before the lightbulb came on? You worked hard to remain calm and patient and I'm glad. You didn't realize how important that moment was at the time but later you shall know fully, even as you are fully known. Or do you remember that time when someone's wife was out of town and you invited her husband over to your family dinner because you knew he couldn't cook? You didn't really know much you encouraged that guy at the time – but later you shall know fully. Let us all let our light shine so when we know fully that may be a day of joy and not regret.
