Should a Christian get a Tattoo? (Part 2)

This is the second article on "What does the Bible have to say about tattoos?" My goal is to inform, not to condemn or look down on anyone with a tattoo, (See last week's article). But I believe the issue needs to be discussed for the fact that many have asked me what the Bible says about tattoos.

First, there is only one Bible verse found that specifically talks about tattoos; Lev 19:28 which reads, "You shall not make any cuts on your body for the dead or tattoo yourselves: I am the LORD." In the context of this passage God is instructing the Israelites how they are to live their day to day life and this passage about tattoos as well as the other instructions found in Lev. 19 were teaching the Israelites that they were to be totally different from the pagan people around them.

Tattoos were a common practice among many ancient people such as the Egyptians, Babylonians, and other ancient barbaric people. The ancient people used tattoos for various reasons for worshiping pagan gods, victories in war, weddings, and funeral practices. But notice that in Lev. 19:28 that God is very clear that He does not want the Israelites to be like the other nations of people in that day in any way. As with the other commands of God in the Law of Moses, God wanted the Israelites to be set apart, holy, and a godly example to the other nations. God was concerned not just with the Israelites religious practice but also in the Israelite appearance because even their bodies represented God.

So, is this command still in effect today? It is true that Jesus nailed the Law of Moses to the cross (Col. 2:14). So, the Law of Moses is abolished because of Christ's cross and we no longer need to offer animal sacrifices, make grain offerings, and go to the Temple and things of this nature. But the Old Testament is still to be an example to us according to 1 Cor. 10:3. If Lev. 19:28 is to be an example to us today it is that we are to be different and set apart from those who are not Christians. Being set apart from the evil world is still taught in the New Testament for example the last part of James 1:27 reminds Christians, "to keep oneself unstained from the world." Although not specifically talking about tattoos, it would include them along with other evil influences of the world. Remember tattoos are nothing new, they have been around a long time, and have been used by pagan religions, prostitutes, criminals, superstitious people, put on slaves by slave owners, and other social outcasts. Even today the popularity of tattoos came from prison inmates, street gangs, and other rebellious types of subgroups in society. Would a Christian want to follow these examples or the example of holiness found in the Bible?

God calls His followers in the New Testament to be set apart and different from the world, even our bodies. Notice how we are to treat our bodies in Rom. 12:1,2 which reads, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

I wonder how a Christian could justify getting a tattoo and still follow Rom. 12:1-2 and James 1:27? Think about it! (To be continued to next week) MTT
