Should a Christian get a Tattoo? Part 3

This is the third and last article in this series, "Should a Christian get a Tattoo? In last week's article I looked at Lev. 19:28, James 1:27, and Rom. 12:1,2. But there is another important verse in the New Testament that Christians should consider in regard to tattoos, 1 Cor. 6:19 which states, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own,". This verse is not specifically talking about tattoos, but it can include it. This verse reminds us that sin done in the body does affect us spiritually and physically. Sometimes the things we do in our body hurt our spiritual influence and can also hurt our health.

I Cor. 6:19 is in the context of sexual sin but can be applied to anything one does to the body that will bring harm to it such as smoking, gambling, drugs, overeating, and even tattoos. We must remember as a Christian the body is the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because God dwells in us we must strive to take care of the body; the Temple of God.

Tattoos, although popular, do come with a health warning according to The FDA's site: http://www.fda.gov/ForConsumers/ConsumerUpdates/ucm048919.htm:

Tattoos can cause: *Infection* – Dirty needles can pass infections, like hepatitis B,C and HIV, from one person to another. Allergies – Allergies to various ink pigments in both permanent and temporary tattoos have been reported and can cause problems. **Scarring** – Unwanted scar tissue may form when getting or removing a tattoo. As well as other health problems.

We must remember that tattoo artists are not health care officials, and even in health care, people can make mistake and cause people to get very sick. Most tattoo artists only care about the money and usually do not care about one's health. There are over 700 diseases that can be passed on and contacted from tattoos.

This being true how could a Christian getting a tattoo say they are taking care of the body which God has given them, the Temple of God?

Remember the significance of the temple of God? In the Old Testament, God's temple was a sacred place. It was a place where God Himself resided and where people came to worship Him. Today, God's temple is still a sacred place where God dwells. If Jesus came today and looked at the temple of God in you, would He have the same reaction as He did in Jerusalem with the corrupt merchants in John 2? Would He get angry at what He saw, or would He be proud of what He saw? If Jesus investigated your temple today, would He find it polluted with the influences of sin? Would He find the temple with graffiti on it? What would Jesus think of a "Tramp Stamp"? (A tattoo on the lower part of a females back). Doesn't the name incite lust? Jesus even reminds us in Mt. 5:28 not to look lustfully at a woman, yet some women and men put tattoos on their bodies for this reason? How could this be taking care of the Temple of God?

What we do with our bodies matters to God, because it really is not "our" body, but it belongs to God. 1 Corinthians 10:31 teaches us, "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God."

Some final questions for you to think about:

- How could knowing the health issues that come with tattoos be glorifying God in the body?
- Would I still want this tattoo when I get older?
- Would I want this tattoo knowing that when the body changes with age, (such as weight loss or gain, wrinkles, scars, and surgeries)?
- What would my future mate think of seeing this tattoo for a lifetime?
- Could you imagine Jesus covering His body in tattoos? Piercings?
- What is the reason for getting a tattoo? Is it rebellion, entice lust, or another reason?
- What would an employer say about it? Will it cost you getting a job?
- Tattoos are expensive. Could I use this money more wisely to pay bills, help someone in need, or give to the Lord?
- What is the message I want to say with the tattoo? Could you express that message in another way, maybe even more meaningful?

Christians must look at all the facts, before getting a tattoo and not just listen to popular culture. Think about it! (MTT)

Who Cares?

"Who cares?" is quite the popular phrase these days. Good question. Who does care? I hope you feel like someone does. Is there someone out there who legitimately, truly cares about what you're going through? Is there someone out there who is able to share your pain and help carry your burdens? I hope so – since that sort of thing is commanded in scripture: "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2). But to do so requires that we actually care about one another. "How are you doing?" "Well, to be honest not good. My marriage is falling apart, my kids aren't listening, my doctor said that I have the following six problems . . ." "Okay, never mind! I didn't really care. I was just asking to be polite." Is that us? May it never be! "Love must be sincere" (Romans 12:9).

Unfortunately, getting to the point where we really care about other people takes some work. You can't give what you don't have. If there are sins that have taken residence in your heart you're not going to have a lot of love to give. "Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold" (Matthew 24:12). How much do you think a drug addict cares about other people? Well, whichever one busted into my car and stole my radio and my camera a few years ago didn't care much about me, I can tell you that. Even if it is not that extreme sinful things have that effect. If there is some unrepented of sin in your life it would take a great deal of effort for you to really care about someone other than yourself. So I suggest starting there if you want to care – repent and turn to God. Turn to God's love so you have something good to give to the people around you.

Other than that, this is just a matter of training. "Train yourself to be godly" (1 Timothy 4:7). God cares so much that He gave His one and only Son. We need to train ourselves to care like He does. We have to work to replace thoughts of "how can I get what I want?" with "how can I bless those around me?" We must work to replace "how is this going to affect me?" with "how will this impact the lives of my family and my neighbors?" Let us take the focus of ourselves and begin to care more about others. "Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others" (Philippians 2:4). So who cares? We should. I pray we do.


