He is better than Vaseline

In 1859, Robert Chesebrough was in the oil fields of Pennsylvania when he noticed a waxy material that oozed out of the ground along with the petroleum. "Rod wax" is what the drillers called it and it was a nuisance to them. But it did have one redeeming quality; it helped heal cuts and burns.

When Chesebrough heard that, he knew he had a valuable product. For the next 10 years he devoted his energies to developing a pure, odor-free, effective form of "rod wax". He served as his own guinea pig, cutting his arms, burning his skin, pouring acids on his hands. The results were highly satisfactory: the stuff worked! Chesebrough named his discovery Vaseline, supposedly because early experiments were carried out in his wife's vase.

All he had to do now was convince the public to buy it. With a horse and buggy he cruised the streets of Brooklyn giving out free samples. Orders mushroomed and testimonials flooded in. He was able to sell Vaseline because people had only to look at his wounds, now healed, to see the value of his work and the extent of his belief (Source unknown).

The Bible tells us that because of sin human beings are spiritually sick and are hurting. We need healing to come into our spiritual lives so we can have a relationship with our Creator. This healing could only come through Jesus Christ God's only begotten Son. 1 Peter 2:24 tells us that "Jesus himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed."

Robert Chesebrough's physical wounds were healed because of his invention of Vaseline, our spiritual wounds are healed because Jesus' death on the cross. People's greatest healing comes from the Great Physician (Mt. 9:12) Jesus Christ.

You can apply Jesus' great healing power to your life by responding to Him in trusting obedient faith, (Acts 16:30-31), turning from sin in repentance (Acts 17:30-31), confessing Him before men (Romans 10:9-10), and being baptized (immersed) in His name for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38), then He will heal and save you from your sins and give you the gift of eternal life (Romans 6:23).

Why not apply the healing power of Jesus' blood to your sin sick soul today?



DOUG'S DISCUSSION



Be Strong and Courageous

Doing the work of God is not for cowards. It is not for those who are afraid to do something new. It is not for those who are unwilling to go places they have never gone. Doing the work of God is not for those unwilling to fight the battles that need fought. Joshua was once told: "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid" (Joshua 1:9). Abraham was told to journey to a place he had never seen. Noah was told to build something that had probably never been built before. God sometimes calls us to action that leads to a future that we cannot envision or predict. Those filled with fear won't step out of that boat (or build it) . . . but that's why "we live by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7).

As disciples of Christ we have to be willing to acknowledge that God may (without notice) decide to take us to a new place. You might wake up one morning and see an opportunity for ministry that wasn't there yesterday. "But . . . I've never done that before!" Doesn't matter – God has. "But I won't know what to say!" Who gave man his mouth? Who created the tongue? If God wants you to go He can help you. "But I'm already busy doing these other things for God! I don't have time for this opportunity." Ahh . . . that's the one that gets so many people. Take a minute and evaluate what you're doing. Is it really still for God or are you busy in these ways because it's the comfortable thing you have always done? Listen – what God wanted you to do in ministry yesterday may not be what He wants you to do today. Love your neighbor is timeless. The most effective WAY to love your neighbor can change depending on the time and the person.

I guess what I'm asking is . . . are you someone who is willing to go on an adventure and try something new? Would you travel like Abraham? Would you build a boat like Noah? Would you confidently march into enemy territory like Joshua? These men are now celebrated in scripture because they acted on faith. Perhaps it won't be on the same scale but you will have this opportunity too. The next time you open up your Bible ask as you read: "how can I live this out? How can I be faithful to this inspired Word?" And then go and do . . . even if it is something that you have never done before. "But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it – not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it – they will be blessed in what they do" (James 1:25).
