

How to have a great Friends & Family Day?

I once attended Tom Butterfields' Church Growth workshop. The following are some things that Tom has suggested as well as ideas I have picked up over the years that can help our "Friends & Family Day" on Nov. 10 to be a success:

- 1. Use colorful, attractive advertisements. A well-done colorful flyer will get people's attention. Pick up one in the back or you can make your own.
- 2. Get hand written invitations and fliers into the hands of those you are going to invite in advance so they can plan. We have the next two weeks so be sending out the information now.
- 3. People will attend when they are personally invited. George Gallup did a survey and discovered that 65 million Americans have no church home, but 34 million of them said they would attend if somebody would just invite them. So make an effort to invite someone.
- 4. Create an attractive email or social media message. Send that to all your friends. Don't use it to SPAM people. Just send to your friends. Send one invitation per email address.
- 5. Get the building and grounds in order. View the building and grounds as a first time visitor would view it. You might be surprised what you learn about us. Also, we might find many changes that need to be made to make ourselves more helpful to visitors. Plus, we all can pick up after ourselves, it is amazing the things we leave behind in our seats, that can cause visitors to feel unwelcomed and discourage them from coming back to worship with us.
- 6. Take time between worship and Bible class to meet and greet visitors and help them to find a Bible class.
- 7. Members who are physically able should try to park away from the building, leaving the closest spaces for visitors. Members should try to sit up closer to the front of the building if possible so those arriving late and visitors can sit in the back.
- 8. All members be friendly and greet our visitors help with directions, e.g. to classrooms, restrooms, etc. Also invite them to sit with you and help them fill out an attendance card and personally invite them back to our services again.
- 9. Follow up before the next Sunday. The key to getting our guests back to services is to visit, call, and send a note. All three of these things need to be done by different members. Will you be willing to follow up? All you need to do is tell them thank you for visiting and invite them back again.

Make sure that our guests take home a visitor's packet or bulletin, don't let any visitor leave without putting something in their hand.

Church, these are some suggestions that are to help us have a great Friends & Family Day. Let's make Nov. 10 a great day! Don't forget to invite our guests to the meal following Bible Class as well!



DOUG'S DISCUSSION

Make Your Deeds Count

So you just did a good deed? Wonderful. I'm glad you did something to make the world a better place. Really – I mean that. I suspect you're glad as well. When I do something to help someone I feel good about it afterward. I also like the idea that God is pleased with me . . . that He will see my good deeds and perhaps reward me in some way for what I did for Him. And maybe He will. Unfortunately, there is also the possibility that God is not impressed.

Let's say you have a parent who is in real need. A place in your home would be an enormous blessing – but you haven't got along with this parent for years. You don't enjoy their company. So this parent, whose spouse has long died, ends up in a nursing home. You're asked for visits but you never can find the time. However, you go to church and even attend Bible class. You helped in last year's VBS. Are these good deeds accepted? Maybe not. "Anyone who does not provide for their relatives, and especially for their own household, has denied the faith . . ." (1 Timothy 5:8). Yes, you're doing good things – but you're ignoring the very important good deed God has placed right in front of you.

Let's say you have been offended and you're unwilling to forgive. But you sing praises three times a week, so it's fine . . . right? Better check Matthew 5:24. Let's say you put money in the offering plate. That's a good deed that supports my ministry. But what if you're a business owner that finds every opportunity to stiff your workers the rest of the week? Better check Isaiah 1:11-17. What if you give a tenth of your spices but neglect justice, mercy, and faithfulness? Better check Matthew 23:23.

Good deeds are wonderful. But there are plenty of times in scripture when God is less interested in the good deed you want to do than the good deed God expects you to do. We cannot pick and choose what parts of the Bible to follow. If you're telling God "no" in any way I suggest you give in and submit. Otherwise I fear all your other good deeds won't count.
