Friendly or Frigid?

George Plagenz, a syndicated religious columnist, recently wrote an article, "Is Your Church Friendly Enough?" He made unannounced visits to several churches, rating each one on friendliness.

A rating system was created for grading church friendliness: 10 points for a smile, 10 points for a greeting, 100 points for an exchange of names, 200 points for an invitation to coffee, 1000 points for an introduction to another worshiper, and 2000 points for an invitation to meet the preacher. Of the 18 churches visited, 11 earned fewer than 100 points. Five got fewer than 20! The other two got just over 1000 points.

I wonder how we would rate? I wonder if visitors perceive us as friendly or frigid? Have you ever sat in a mall, restaurant, or airport and just watched people? When visitors attend our services they watch us. They notice our smiles and our frowns. They see us putting our hearts into singing praises or simply mumbling tunes. They observe us listening attentively to the sermon; showing our support with smiles, nods, and "Amens"or they see us sitting stone faced, daydreaming about the afternoon's activities.

James asks us to consider our actions toward strangers and visitors in chapter two of his epistle. He concludes his thoughts with the admonition, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Ask yourself, "How would I like to be welcomed if I were visiting a different church? " "What kind of spirit would I like to see demonstrated by the worshipers?" "What would encourage and what would discourage a return on my part?"

Now that you've considered the question...Act! Love your visitor as yourself. A smile, handshake, or introduction on your part is more important than you realize. Don't neglect our part in giving visitors and mem-

bers a warm welcome. That first handshake might be the beginning of a beautiful friendship that will last through eternity.

DOUG'S DISCUSSION

The Way

Some lanes and roads can only be accessed (legally) under certain conditions. I imagine to drive in the carpool lane you're supposed to have a coworker as a passenger. To get on a turnpike you have to get a ticket and pay a toll. And many people do since it tends to be a nicer drive. Having driven in places where everyone around me seemed to be nuts I can say definitively that some roads are nicer than others.

Isaiah calls one of these nice roads the "Way of Holiness." There are conditions to get on. You cannot be spiritually unclean. There are no wicked fools on this road. This road is only for those who "walk in that Way" (Isaiah 35:8). Whatever the cost to get on this road it is worth it. For one thing, this road is safe. No lions to be seen. No one is dropping rocks from the overpass. Not one person is driving with a complete lack of concern for others. As soon as you get on this road you can let go of all the fear and anxiety that comes from less desirable roads. Here's another reason to "walk in that way": this road leads to a good destination. When those on that road reach where they're going "Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away" (Isaiah 35:10).

How do you get on this road you ask? You may find it interesting to know that Christianity is sometimes called "the Way." Paul once said, "I admit that I worship the God of our fathers as a follower of the Way" (Acts 24:14). And maybe you know Jesus once said "I am the way... No one comes to the father except through me" (John 14:6). There is a road you can travel and be free from fear. There is a road that leads to a great destination. Jesus is on this road. He leads those who follow Him to the Father in heaven. Are you following Jesus? There is no other way out there that gets you to where you want to be. No other road is so beautiful. No other road ends in such joy.
