Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery I'MA NOBODY

This past summer I had the opportunity to speak at a VBS hosted by a local congregation. It was a great evening and we had a good number of children and adults who attended. When it was announced that I was speaking, a good friend of mine, told another preacher, who is also a friend, that I was speaking and the preacher said something like, "why are you having "No name Tonkery" speak? Well it was all in fun.

But as I thought about that conversation, I guess I am a "nobody." I can relate to Amos who said in Amos 7:14, "...I was no prophet, nor a prophet's son, but I was a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore figs." Well I am not a prophet, I am trying to be a preacher, and it is true I am not a son of a preacher, and there has never been a preacher in my close family. It is also true; I do not get asked to speak at many Gospel Meetings or Lectureships and none of my articles have been published in any major brotherhood publications, that I know of. So, by many people's standards I am probably a "nobody."

But that is o.k. because when I read the Bible, I find that there are many people who are unnamed or little is known about them, yet God still used them in a mighty way. For example:

In Mark 12:42-44 we learn about a widow who put in two small copper coins into the temple treasury, and Jesus honors her, but she is never named. Then there is in Luke 7:36-50 a sinful woman who anointed Jesus' feet. Jesus forgives her sins and tells her, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace." Scripture never mentions her name or tells us what happened to her, yet she is known for her great faith.

The Bible goes on to tell us about countless other people, many never named, such as: the soldier who confessed Jesus as the Son of God at His crucifixion, the robber who wanted to be with Jesus in Paradise, the wisemen and shepherds who came to see Jesus after His birth. These people were just no named people who God used to do His will and carry out His plan to bring salvation to the world.

So, I guess I am in good company, the company of the "no named, nobodies." As one missionary once said, "We are a bunch of nobodies exulting and telling about a Somebody. Who is Christ!"

May we never forget 1 Cor. 8:3 which tells us, "But if anyone loves God, he is known by God." So, I guess if I am a "nobody" then it is a good thing that I love God, because the Bible tells me that He knows who I am and that is really the only One who needs to know that I am a somebody.

Now what about you? Does God know you? Are you a faithful child of God? Do you nurture your relationship with prayer, worship, Bible study, and obedience? Or are you and God, strangers, you cannot remember the last time you prayed, worship is boring, you never open your Bible, and the only way you invoke God's name is in profanity? God knows. Pro. 24:12, states, "You may say that it is none of your business, but God knows and judges your motives. He keeps watch on you; he knows. And he will reward you according to what you do." Think about it! In Christ, Mark T. Tonkery a.k.a. "No Name Tonkery"

DOUG'S DISCUSSION

God Speaks Therefore It Is

Our God is said to call "things that are not as though they were" (Romans 4:12). To some that sounds like God makes things up. Sarai clearly thought that when she was told she was going to have a child in her old age. She laughed like these words of God were a big joke. Indeed, Sarai's son was a "thing that was not." There was no son and all common sense said there would never be. But God spoke of an impossible currently non-existent reality and "Abram believed the Lord, and he credited it to him as righteousness" (Genesis 15:6).

Here's the thing – faith requires that we believe God's words before we actually see them come true. Faith requires that we take God at His Word even when those words seem extremely unlikely. Remember that we are talking about a God who looked at nothing and spoke an entire universe into existence. God spoke and things that were not suddenly were. People of faith believe God can do that again whenever He wills.

Long ago Jerusalem was under siege against an impossible enemy. The land was about to be made waste and the people taken captive. Under these conditions a relative of Jeremiah said "hey man, do you want to buy my soon to be worthless field?" (my paraphrase of Jeremiah 32:8). This seems like a bad business decision but at the word of the Lord Jeremiah buys it! Even though there was no reason to hope Jeremiah believed the Lord when he told him to seal the deed in a clay jar, for "Houses, fields and vineyards will again be bought in the land" (Jeremiah 32:15). Yes, it was currently a thing that was not. God says it will be.

These heroes of the faith are our example whenever we do not currently see the promises of God. Do you get it? It doesn't matter if right now "they are not." If God says they are, they are. Today I deal with death, mourning, crying and pain. For me, in this place and time, a life without these things "is not." But God speaks of a place I have never seen, a place where all sorrow and loss is nonexistent. God says it is . . . so it is.
