Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

<u>PEOPLE OF INTEGRITY</u>

Read almost any business book, self-help book, or do a search on the internet on articles of how to be a better person and one will come across the word "integrity."

The Bible is also full of examples of individuals who were people of integrity. People like Caleb, Ruth, Job, Paul, and many others lived their lives before God and were people with integrity.

Willard Tate described integrity this way, "The word comes from the mathematical term "integer", a number that hasn't been divided into fractions. It's a whole number. And a person with integrity is a man or woman whose life is not divided against itself [by lying, immorality, cheating, gossiping, stealing, drinking, or dishonesty] someone who enjoys wholeness and completeness" (Habits of a Loving Heart p. 96).

In other words, integrity is more than just telling the truth, it is living the truth, being a truthful person all the time. It is being what we say we are, even when no one is looking; not being hypocritical, deceitful, or untrustworthy.

Proverbs 11:3, teaches that, "The integrity of the upright guides them, but the crookedness of the treacherous destroys them."

Dennis Waitley, in an article entitled, "Your Absolute Bottom Line," published in *Priorities Magazine*, shared this story that well illustrates integrity.

In the operating room of a large, well-known hospital, it was the nurse's first day on the medical team. She was responsible that all instruments and materials were accounted for before completing the final steps of the operation. She said to the surgeon, "You've only removed 11 sponges. We used 12 sponges, and we need to find the last one."

"I removed them all," the doctor declared emphatically. "We'll close the incision now." "No," the rookie nurse objected, "we used 12 sponges."

"I'll take the responsibility," the surgeon said grimly. "Suture."

"You can't do that, sir," blazed the nurse. "Think of the patient."

The surgeon smiled and lifted his foot, showing the nurse the twelfth sponge. "You'll do just fine in this or any other hospital."

Dishonest people and practices have plagued our society. Companies, government, families, schools, and sadly, even in the church; people have been cheated, lied to, used, and have been victims of dishonest practices; yet this seems to be the norm today. But integrity should be one of the characteristics of the Church. Above all, honesty and integrity should be a characteristic of each Christian.

Jesus put it this way "One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches?" (Luke 16:10-11). Think about it! In Christ, Mark T. Tonkery

DOUG'S DISCUSSION

The Wet Log is Worth It

My teenage son went hunting with his grandfather last week – an event that both of them were really looking forward to. It was his first time going. When my son got back I asked him how it went. He said "I spent twelve hours sitting on a wet log. We saw a deer once but it ran away before we could get it." Do you know what really blows my mind? He wants to go again. To get his first deer my son is willing to sit on a wet log for another full day. I'm not a hunter myself so I don't get it . . . but I admire the dedication.

Such is to be our dedication for reaching out to the lost! Once Jesus used fishing as an analogy for evangelism. He was speaking to men who knew all about sitting for hours with little success. But that wasn't going to stop them, even when they went all night without catching anything. They were fishermen – and I fully believe they were going to go out and fish the next night too anyway. Jesus talks to men with that kind of mindset and tells them: "Come, follow me . . . and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19).

One truth about evangelism is that it's not easy. Most people are not going to experience standing on a stage, proclaiming the gospel, and seeing hundreds obey. God be praised if you do! Thus far God has worked through me in a different way. Sometimes, despite considerable effort, I don't "catch" anything at all. I may get to know someone, spend hours talking to them on the phone, bring up spiritual matters time and time again and STILL not see that person come to Christ. But here's the thing about fishing: if you keep going out there eventually you're going to catch something. Skills will improve with practice. Knowledge will grow. Eventually a fish comes along that is hungry enough to bite.

I want to encourage all the "hunters" out there. There are deer in the forest. There are fish in the stream. There are people who are interested in spiritual things. However, if you give up after your first twelve hours of no visible results you'll never know the truth of this. You won't experience the joy that happens when someone you have been talking to finally comes to the Lord. That's worth sitting on a wet log. Every minute of it.
