What will help the Church to start Growing?

As was discussed in last week's article there are at least three things that stop church growth: lack of people, lack of money, and lack of Biblical teaching. So, if we just reverse this then, we will have the ingredients for church growth.

First if the church is going to grow, we need people. Jesus tells us in Mark 16:15, "...Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation." So to bring people to the gospel of Jesus and His church we must be evangelistic, meaning we must invite people to our services, study the Bible with people, and get the message of the gospel in the ears of lost people. This is not always easy, and not everyone we talk to will want to hear, so we must keep at it and not get discouraged.

When we do invite people to our church services the rest of the congregation can help by being friendly to our guest. Growing congregations have friendly members – not only during times of worship but outside of the building as well. So, let's look for someone we do not know when we gather as a church and introduce ourselves and make our guest feel at home.

We can also help connect with people by visiting one another. Congregations that do not visit, don't grow. In Luke 15 Jesus shows us that God cares for people, especially lost people. We must show people we care; we must visit the sick, the lost, those who have visited our worship, the delinquent, and those new to the area. Visiting and fellowshipping with one another will not only help people be introduced to the congregation but will help people to stay with the congregation. People need encouragement to stay faithful (Heb. 3:13).

Remember we are in the people business, let's be "people persons" as we seek the lost and help the saved, stay saved.

Second, we must be good givers of our finances and of our time. Jesus calls each of His followers to be servants in Matthew 23:11. As a servant we are instructed by God's word to give our money (1 Cor. 16:1,2 and 2 Cor. 9) and of our ability (Rom. 12:3-8). Although the New Testament never gives an amount we are to give, it does tell us in 2 Co 9:7, that, "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

When Christians give it helps spread the gospel, supports needed missionary works, and makes it possible for others to do the Lord's work, so the church may grow, spiritually and numerically.

Third, the church must grow spiritually. Peter encourages spiritual growth in 2 Pt. 3:18 by saying, "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen." If the congregation is going to grow then each member needs to desire to learn and apply the scriptures to their everyday life, we cannot be comfortable where we are spiritually, we must have a growing faith. One way a growing faith happens is in one's faithful attendance in worship and Bible study (Heb. 10:25).

Question: Why would a non-Christian be interested in a congregation that its members did not attend? It is hard to show people we care about them spiritually if we do not meet with the church to be spiritually fed ourselves.

We must remember faith comes by hearing the Word of Christ (Rom. 10:17). Growing Christians and congregations are dedicated to Christ, and His word. Elders, Deacons, Bible class teachers, and ministers must be grounded in the Word of God and use the Bible as their foundation for teaching. Worship must be done in spirit and truth (John 4:24) which honors the Lord. Those who lead must do so with a desire, enthusiasm, and willingness to help people come to a greater relationship with Almighty

God.

Congregations are designed to grow. Read the book of Acts. But the growth will only come when we do the spiritual planting and water that God commands (1 Cor. 3:6).

Let's get back to the basics of God's word and let's help grow the church! God Bless, Mark T.

Doug's Discussion

Resistance Starts in Your Mind

In my experience when skilled preachers fail it is for one of two reasons. Either they are poor at managing money or they have an affair. I really like my job – so I certainly want to avoid anything that could derail my career . . . and more importantly my ministry. But how do I make sure these things don't happen? I don't think believing that I'm immune to temptation is the answer, but I do think there's a very helpful guide in the ten commandments.

Commandment #7 is don't commit adultery. Commandment #8 is do not steal. Two very good commandments for ministers (and every Christian) to keep in mind. I personally saw a minister lose all credibility by defrauding a church out of thousands of dollars. I personally saw a preacher lose a job because he was caught going to a hotel with someone other than his wife. It happens. But Lord, how can I make sure it doesn't happen to me? I think one of God's answers to that is found in the tenth commandment: "You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor" (Exodus 20:17). Following this command can prevent you from breaking several that come before it.

Resistance to sin starts in our minds. I am confident that asking a church to cosign a loan (with no intention to pay it back) started with coveting a shiny red truck. Had there been contentment with the blessings God provided the theft never would have happened. Had David kept his eyes to himself, had he been content with the blessings God had already provided, two earlier commandments would have been kept. If I want to avoid these pitfalls I need to keep how much I like what other people have out of my head. God has given me plenty. I need to respect God enough that I choose not to think of doing such things, praying that the "fear of God will be with [me] to keep [me] from sinning" (Exodus 20:20). Keeping my thoughts where they should be will surely lead to more and better ministry. I pray I avoid coveting. I pray you do as well.

Sometimes my kids will ask me if we can go get ice cream. My reply often is: "maybe if you're good." If you're good at this store, if no one gets into a wrestling match, if only kind words are said . . . then there's a good chance ice cream is in your future. And, of course, since I also like ice cream I'm really hoping they are good. I do this to teach an important lesson: good things happen to those who do what is right.

I didn't come up with that idea. Psalm 84:7 says about God "no good thing will he withhold from those who walk uprightly." I reward my kids when they do what is right because that's what God does.
