



Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

Spread your wings and fly

There's a fable told of a barnyard of geese that gathered each week to hear their eldest repeat the story of the Great White Gander who, long ago, spread his magnificent wings and flew over the barnyard fence to freedom. The story was well told and so inspiring that all the geese would honk their approv-



al and sometimes even flapped their wings in excitement. Each week they would repeat this ritual because it was a very important part of their lives. But, oddly enough, it never occurred to any of them to actually spread their own wings and fly. (Story by Søren Kierkegaard).

This little tale reminds me of what many do each Lord's Day. Many gather to listen to the Word of God, sing some hymns, say a few prayers, partake of the Lord's Supper, give of their means, fellowship, and then leave the building only to do the same thing again the following week, with never a thought to do anything with the challenge of God's Word between each meeting. For so many we are like those geese in the story, we never actually get around to "spreading our wings and flying."

James 1:22, reminds us, "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." James explains that God expects us to do something with His message. God wants His people to be a "living sacrifice" (Rom. 12:1-2). However, many in Christianity miss this. They miss the sacrifice, the surrender, the dying to self, and giving their all to the Lord. Many forget that Christianity is a religion of sacrifice. Jesus said in Matthew 10:37-39, "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

There must be a place and time in our faith, we say "no," to jobs, family, hobbies, activities, things, and places, so we can say "yes" to God and be "doers of the Word". Now it is true we are to be Christians in these activities, but the Bible also teaches that we must do something for the Lord and that is the sacrifice, stopping and doing what the Lord asks us to do, hearing and doing. So not only is Christianity a sacrificing religion, it is a practicing religion.

I am glad that you came to worship this morning. I am glad that you said "no" to jobs, family, things, and places so you can be here to worship and hear the Word of God preached and taught. But once that last "amen" is spoken will you do something for the Lord, maybe call on someone who missed services, send someone a card, visit someone in the nursing home, sit down and teach a child a Bible lesson, or in some way be a "doer of the word." After all James 1:27, teaches us, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world."

Let's not be like that flock of geese that just flapped their wings when they could have been flying. In Christ, Mark T. Tonkery

Doug's Discussion

Calm in the Storm

A storm was brewing. Just behind the king's eyes clouds of growing rage were rising. Daniel's three friends had dared to ignore the command of a king. Nebuchadnezzar is no doubt confused at what is happening. Normal people would have soon wilted under the intensity of his glare. But here these three men stand – looking totally unconcerned. Don't they realize that he has the power to either kill them or free them? Don't they realize they are inches away from death? Apparently not . . . since they are able to calmly say "we want you to know, O king, that we will not serve your gods" (Daniel 3:4).

In a garden a storm is brewing. Forces amass over the horizon with the intent of destroying Jesus. Yet, the Savior doesn't run, even as those around Him panic and draw swords. They are told to put their swords away as Jesus submits to the turbulent mob. They carry Him away to Pilate, who is absolutely amazed at his demeanor. How can this prisoner possibly look so calm? Why isn't He begging for mercy? Why isn't He pleading His case? Pilate asks Jesus, "Don't you realize I have power either to free you or to crucify you?" (John 19:10). Jesus replies that the real power isn't where you think it is.

In your life a storm is brewing. Relationships are unstable. Finances are uncertain. Winds of change are trying to blow you down. Wouldn't you like to know what made these heroes of the Bible so calm in the storm? As waves threatened to knock over Jesus' boat He was SO unconcerned that He was sleeping! Wouldn't you like to have that kind of peace and confidence? I know I would. You may be interested to know that the confidence of these men came from their faith in an all-powerful God. When threated with a furnace Daniel's friends said "the God we serve is able to save us from it" (Daniel 3:17). When threated with a mob Jesus knew He could call to His Father and He would deliver legions of angels. And when our lives become chaotic we too can know, if we have the faith to believe it, that God is in control. The storm will surely come. Those who trust in the Lord will be unafraid.

If that is the case, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and He will deliver us from your hand, O king.


